
There seems to be another matter dealing with the education reform bill, dealing with consolidation of schools of under 500 students.


But Hart came back for their best quarter of the game, outscoring the Mustangs, 20-8, and taking a 45-40 lead at the end of the period.


The Fillies began to solve Hale FILLIES Center's press and during the fourth quarter, broke Miss Pesch Neal for seven points. Bovina came too late.
