WASHINGTON, Sept. 21. — Since the constitution of the United States was adopted a century and a half ago, Congress has had to deal with such cases as that of Chief Justice John Jay, Chief Justice Roger Taney, and Chief Justice William Marshall. Seven of the cases involved federal judges—one of them an associate justice of the Supreme Court—and in three cases the accused judge was removed from office. One other judge resigned before his impeachment came to trial. All of the other six cases resulted in acquittal.

Convention Opened In New York City Monday By 20,000
NEW YORK, Sept. 21. (P)—In the high emotion of two decades ago, they American Legion was called Monday to fight again—for democracy, for liberty, and for peace. Twenty thousand men, 19 years out of the khaki of an older and a more stirring day, sat in Madison Square Garden's lofty auditorium to open their annual convention—and the memory of a war president died now this half a generation. It was stirred again in what the speakers said.

Scheduled Bombing Of Nanking Being Delayed By Japs
HONG KONG, Sept. 21. (P)—Death-defying aviators fought today in the first great aerial battle of the Orient war over Canton, South China, 100 miles north of here. Bombers crisscrossed twisting dog fights and strafed Chinese. Others may have fallen. A fleet of 21 Japanese raiding ships started the battle. Many civilians were killed by bombs, but buildings were damaged little. American Ambassador Nelson Johnson and his staff evacuated Nanking with expiration of a Japanese ultimatum that foreign lives would not be spared in an effort to destroy the city.

William Blount of Tennessee, who had been interested in a conspiracy with British interests to seize Florida from Spain. Britain to Rearm Unless Others Put Stop to Race Soon
GENEVA, Sept. 21. (P)—British Foreign Minister Anthony Eden, warning his severity with a note of conciliation, warned that Britain is committed irrevocably to a policy of rearmament unless other nations cease competing for supremacy. Speaking before a League of Nations assembly which had voted government Spain out of its council for the next three years, at least Eden struck a note of mingled hope and pessimism. Despite the dark picture he painted and his implied emphasis on Britain's determination still to strive for peace.

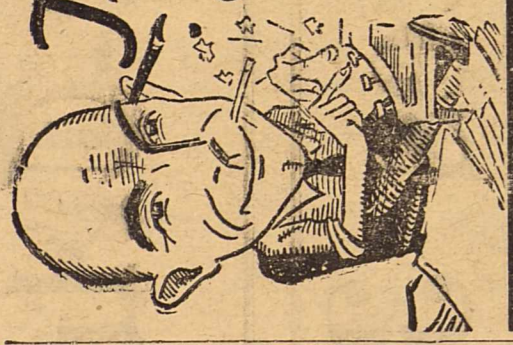

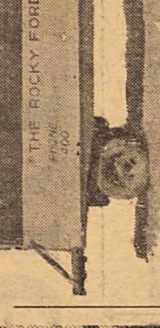

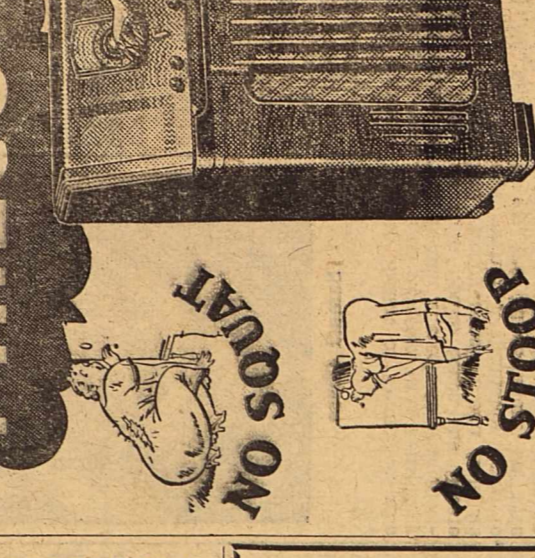
The fish was 21 inches long and weighed five pounds. It was a "stone-lifter," also known as a "slaugazer," which is found only under water.
