Burial was in Bovina Cemetery under the direction of Blackwell Funeral Home.

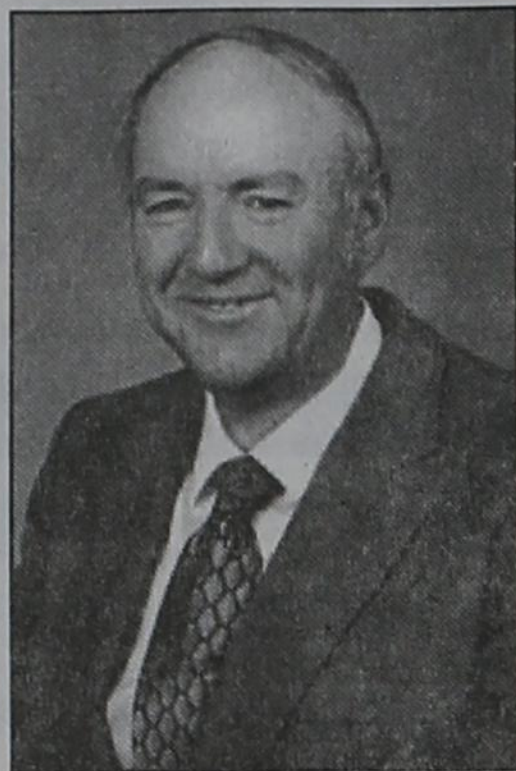
Garner died Friday, January 24, 2003 at BSA-West in Amarillo.

Born July 10, 1934 in Plainview, he married LaQueta Chaney on September 9, 1955 in Clovis, New Mexico. They had lived in the Bovina area since 1959, moving from Plainview.

He graduated from Texas Tech University in 1956 with a degree in animal husbandry and served in the U.S. Army as a military policeman. He was a farmer.

An active member of Bovina's First Baptist Church, he served as a deacon since 1972, served on the Bovina School Board nine years and was a member of the Chamber of Commerce in Bovina.

Survivors include his wife, LaQueta Garner of Bovina; a daughter and son-in-law, Donell and David Callender of Lubbock; a son and daughter-in-law, Doyle and Gilda Garner of Bovina; son Tim Garner of Clovis, New Mexico; and one step-brother,

Michael Carson, son of Elaine and Galen Carson, is part of a New Mexico Army National Guard unit that has been deployed to Cannon Air Force Base to provide security for at least a year.

About 112 guardsmen will be deployed to Cannon from their homes in eastern New Mexico and Texas, including 36 from Clovis' 4th Battalion, Battery C.

Other battalions will be activated to defend air bases in New Mexico and across the country. The war on terror caused many of the Air Force's security personnel to be shipped overseas.

As a result, the Army National Guard is being utilized to provide security at 163 of the nation's Air Force bases in the U.S.

Members of Carson's unit have been preparing for the deployment since December. They have undergone physicals, done their paperwork and made out wills designating powers of attorney. At press time, they were at Fort Bliss in El Paso where they will continue their training.

RARE WIN OVER STEERS

Shepherd's Late Shot Highlights 59-57 Win

The Bovina gym was packed. It started out noisy and stayed that way through 32 minutes of back and forth basketball between Parmer County rivals, the Farwell Steers and Bovina Mustangs.

It was not just a rivalry game. The Mustangs' only two district losses had been to Farwell and Sudan. Bovina needed a win to stay in the District 3-1A playoff race.

They finished the first half of district play with a 3-2 record. Now, after three consecutive second-half victories, the Mustangs are 6-2 in district with Springlake-Earth and Sudan left on the schedule tonight and Tuesday.

The Farwell game Friday night began at 6:30 p.m. because the Fillies game was forfeited to the Lady Blue due to the recent flu epidemic that hit Bovina schools.

Led by senior captain B. J. Shepherd, the Mustangs had a 20-point second quarter to hold on to a 29-29 tie at the half and a 45-41 lead at the end of the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, in spite of a Farwell press, the Mustangs maintained their composure and determination, drawing 16 free throw opportunities from the aggressive Steer defense in the last 8 minutes which the Mustangs turned into 8 points (50%). The Mustangs allowed the Steers only 5 free throw attempts in the final quarter.

Jeff Casas, Shepherd and Raymond Chisom did a fine job of breaking the Farwell full court press and reducing turnovers. Shepherd scored 16 points in the first half, including three 3-pointers. He added 14 more in the second half to lead the Mustangs with 30 points.

But it was his last shot, with less than five seconds left on the clock, which gave the Mustangs the exciting victory. A 3-point shot by Farwell's Grant Gregory with less than a minute to play, tied the score at 57-57.

On the inbound, Casas avoided the press and got the ball to Shepherd. He weaved his way down the floor to about the free throw circle where the Steers had built a three-defender barricade.

After a leaping halt, Shepherd bounded up for a jump shot over the Steer defense and the ball was "nothing but net." With 2.8 seconds on the clock, the Steers were unable to move the ball into shooting position, lofted a desperate

half court throw, missed, game over. Mustangs 59, Farwell Steers 57.

In addition to Shepherd's 30 points, Jonathan Chisom had 12, R. Chisom 7, J. Casas 4, M. Nieto 3, Jake Steelman 2, A. Martinez 1.

Earlier, the Mustangs opened the second round of district play with a 67-59 victory over Kress. Shepherd again led scoring with 25 points, J. Chisom 15, J. Casas 12, M. Nieto 6, R.

Chisom 4, N. Rodriguez 3, J. Steelman 2.

As an encore to the Farwell victory, the Mustangs traveled to Hart Tuesday and scored a 62-52 victory over the Longhorns.

Shepherd scored 24 points, J. Chisom 13, J. Steelman 8, N. Rodriguez 6, R. Chisom 6, J. Casas 3 and A. Martinez 2.

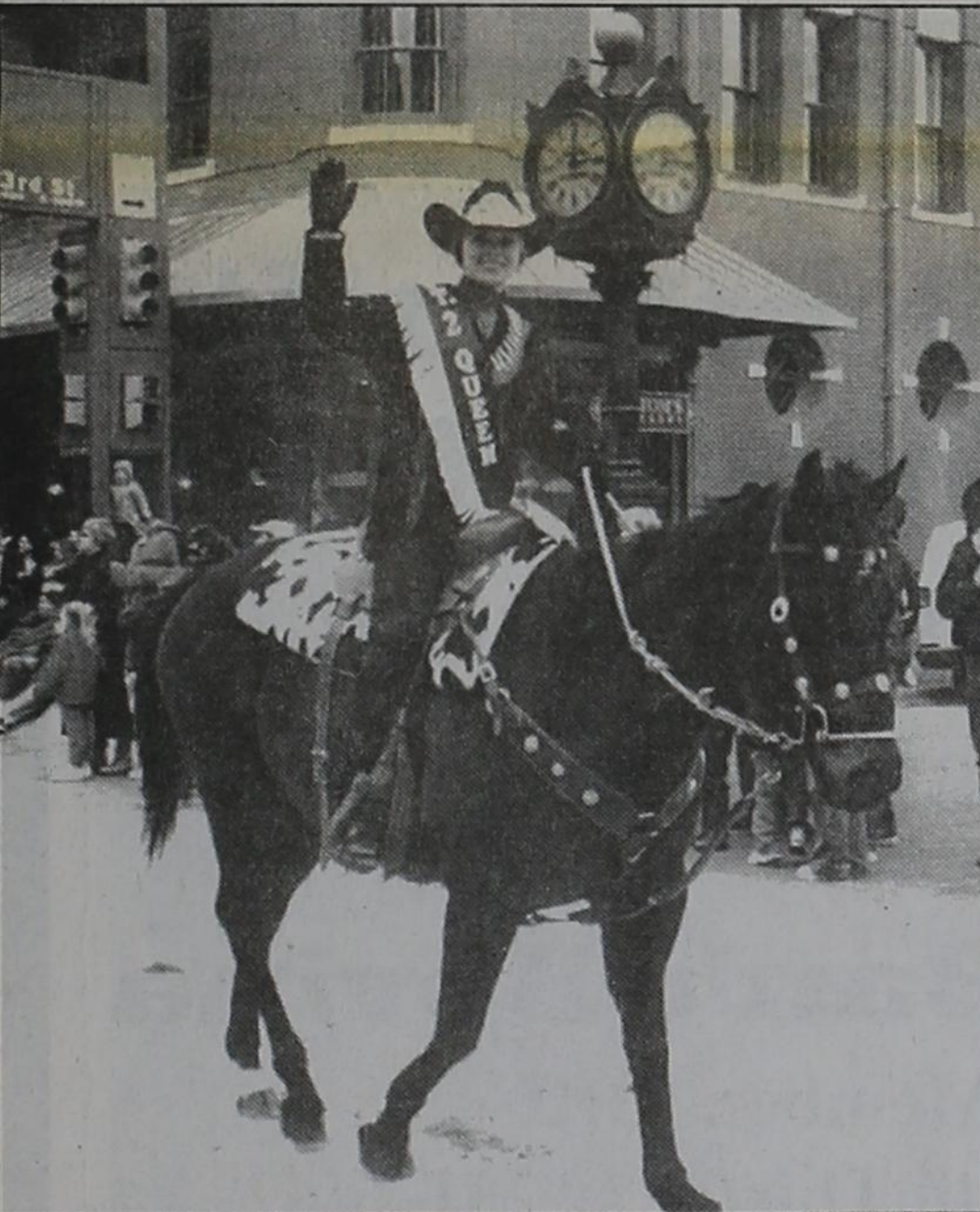
If Farwell and Bovina win their final two games (both play Sudan) the district could end in a 3-way tie for the district championship.

If Sudan beats Farwell tonight, and Bovina wins both remaining games, Bovina wins second place and a playoff spot.

If Farwell and Bovina both lose one of their last two games, they would end up tied for second place and most likely would have to play one game to determine second seed in district.

Regardless of the outcome, the 2002-03 Bovina Mustangs are a talented group of basketball players, that have had a good year, and best of all, accomplished something most teams before them had never done.

four miles long and the grand entry was in front of 6,000 people. Kristen thanked her granddad, M. H. Carson, for the loan of "No Bounds" and his trailer.

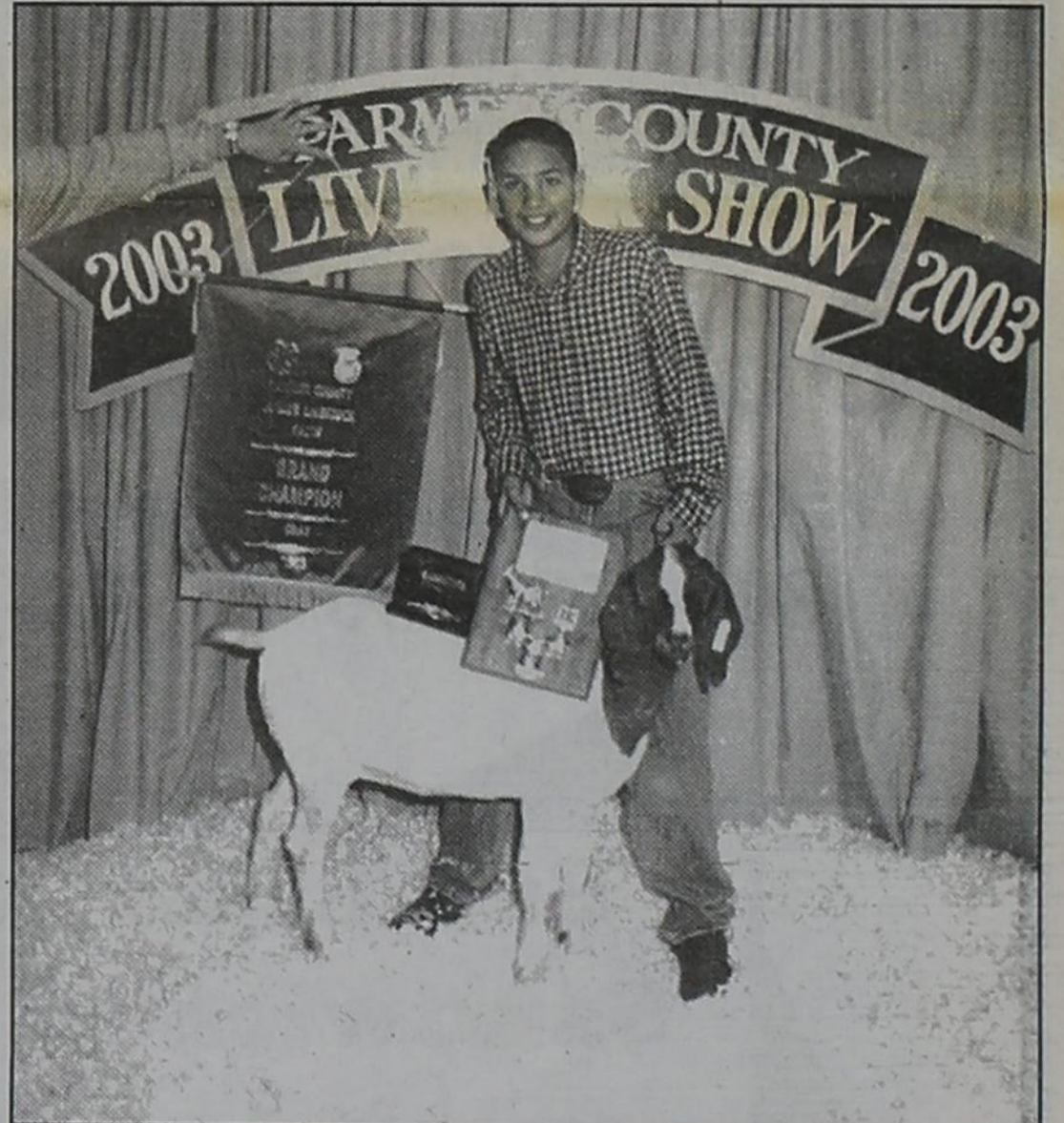
Her next appearance will be at the ABC Rodeo in Lubbock.

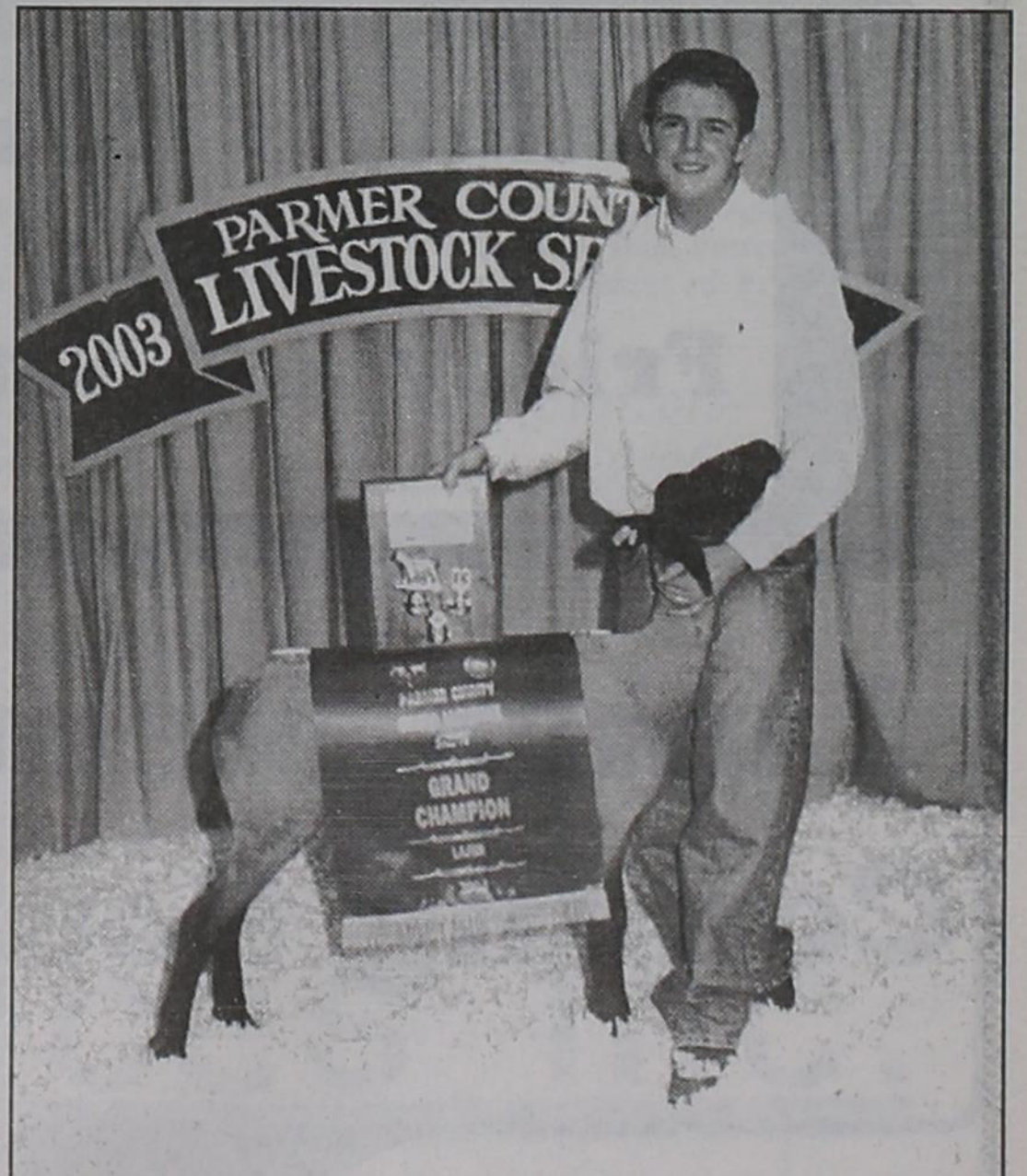

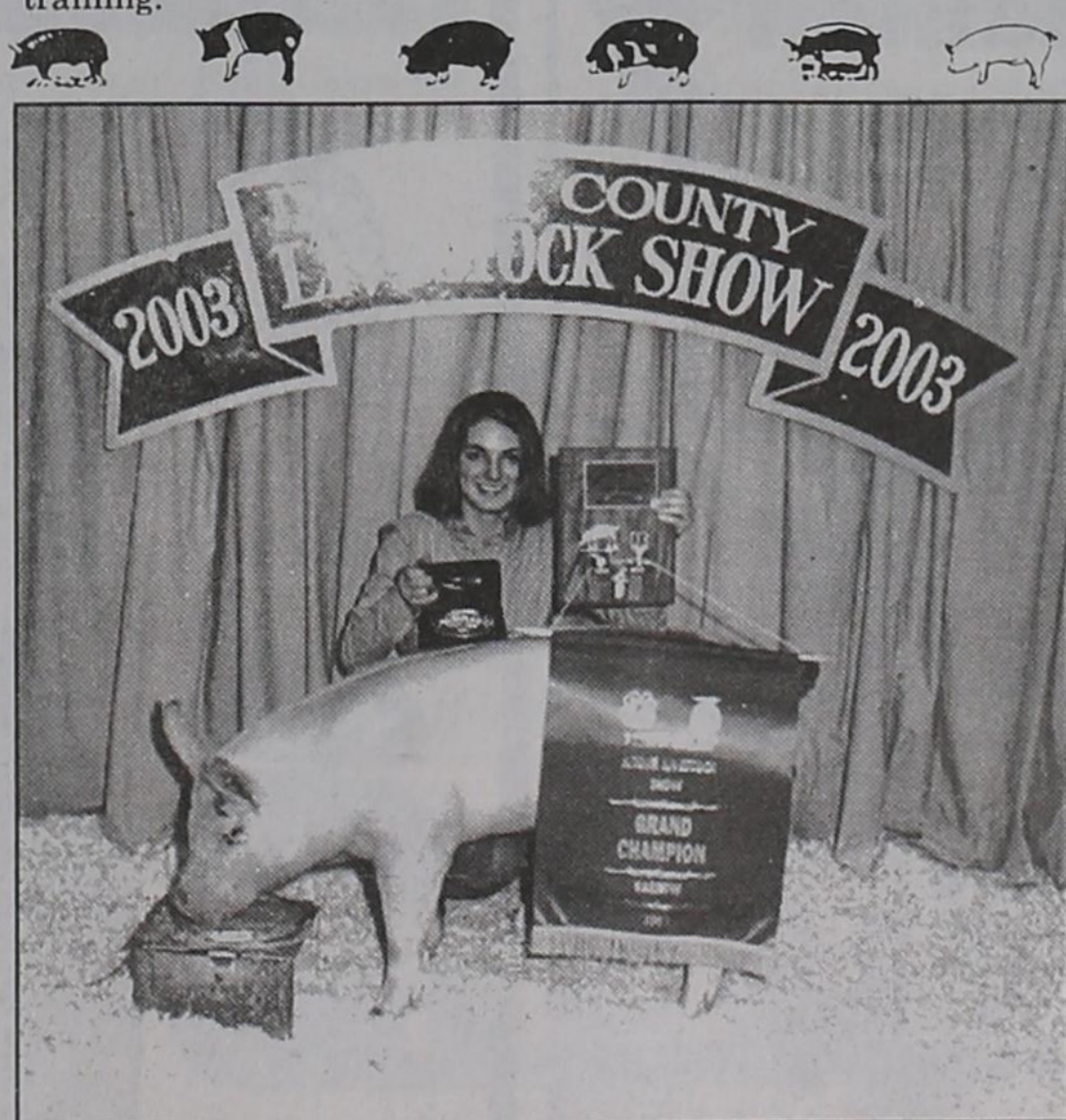

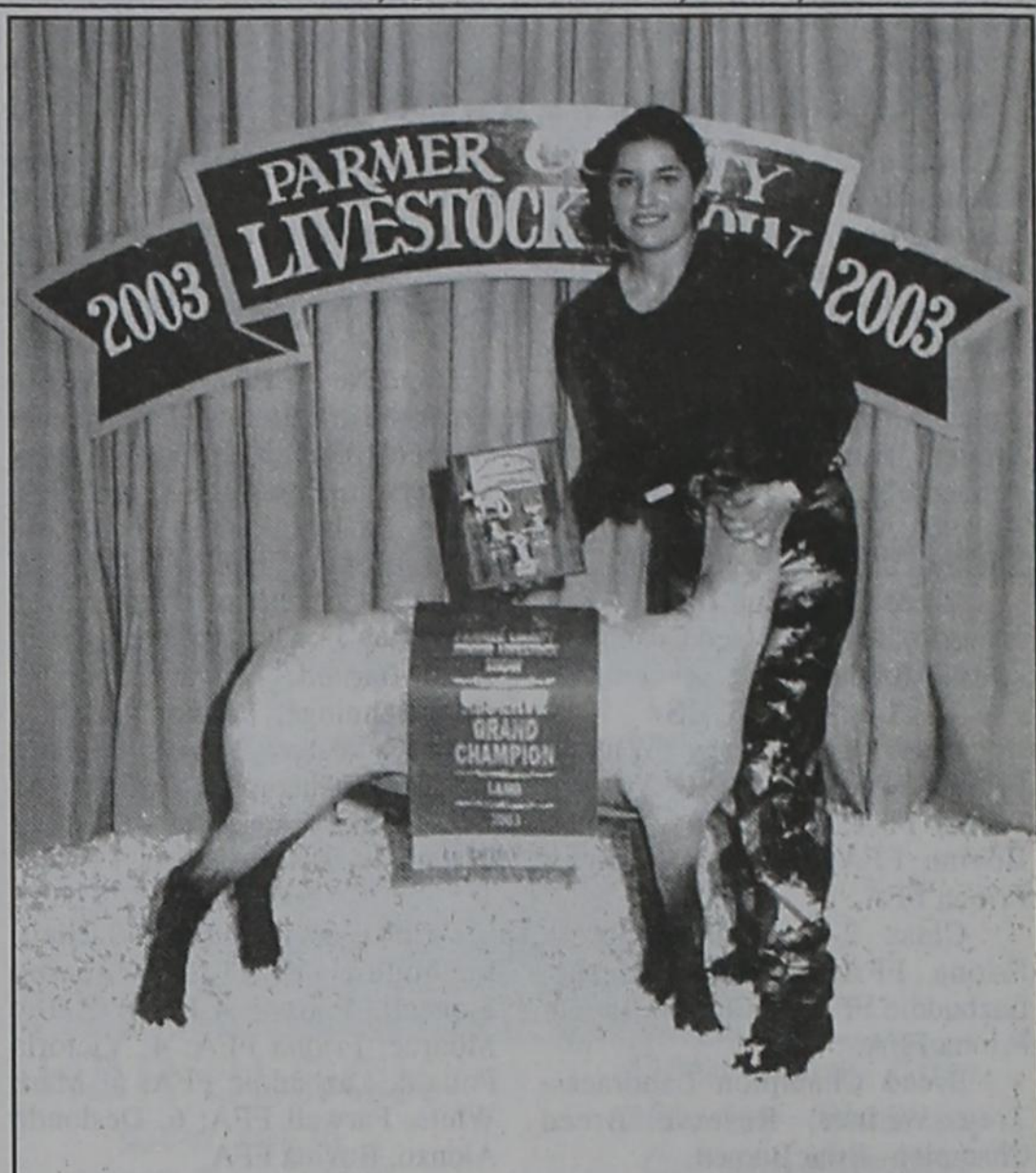

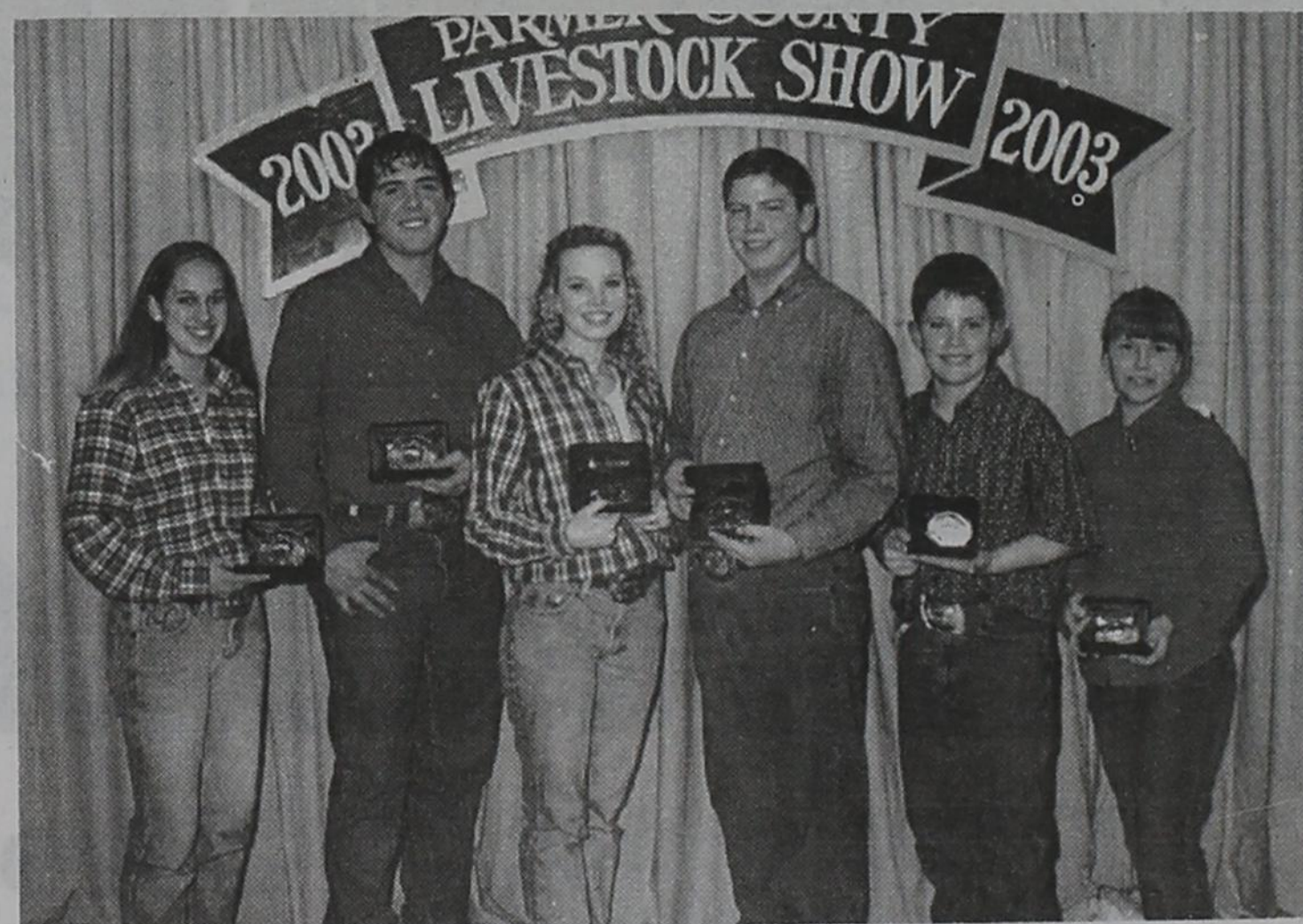

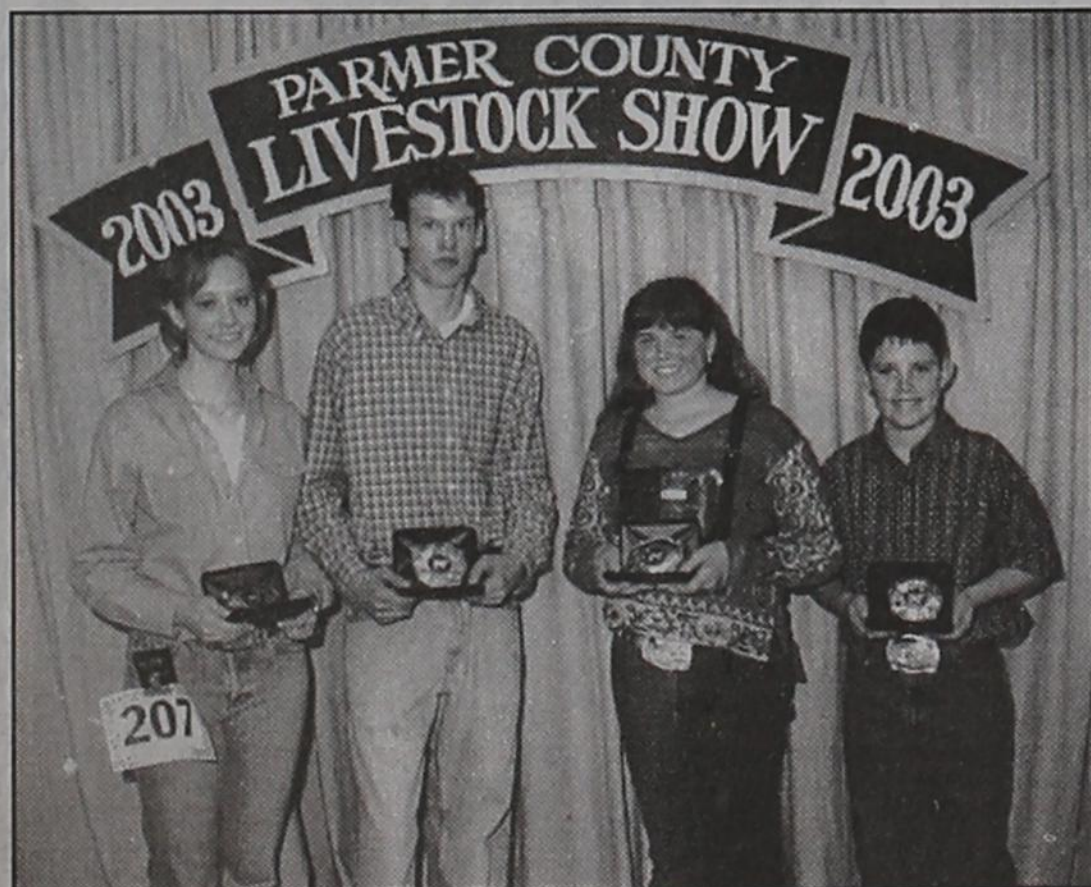

Immunization Clinics Set During February

All flu clinics are for high-risk individuals only, including people who are 65 years old or older, people with chronic illnesses, or people living with someone with a chronic illness. Costs are \$10 for flu vaccine and \$15 for pneumonia vaccine, for those without Medicare.

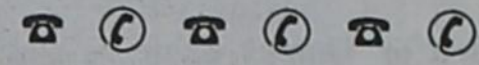

administered at 616 Euclid in Friona, Friday, February 21, from 9:30-11:30 a.m. and 1-3:45 p.m.

Vaccinations will also be available at the Bovina EMS Building, Monday, February 10, from 10-11:45 a.m. and 1-3 p.m.

Section 1. That the Code of Ordinances of the City of Friona, Texas, consisting of Chapters 1 through 14, each inclusive, and Appendices, is hereby adopted and enacted which shall supersede all other general and permanent ordinances of the City passed on or before September 16, 2002.

Section 2. All ordinances of a general and permanent nature enacted on or before September 16, 2002, and not included in the Code or recognized and continued in force by reference therein, are repealed.

Section 3. The repeal provided for in Section 2 hereof shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or part thereof that has been repealed by a subsequent ordinance that is repealed by this ordinance.

Section 4. Unless a differing penalty is expressly provided for within the Code, every person

Section 5. Additions or amendments to the Code when passed in such form as to indicate the intention of the City Council to make same a part of the Code shall be deemed to be incorporated into the Code, so that reference to the Code includes the additions and amendments.

Section 6. Ordinances adopted after September 16, 2002, that amend or refer to ordinances that have been codified in the Code shall be construed as if they amend or refer to like provisions of the Code.

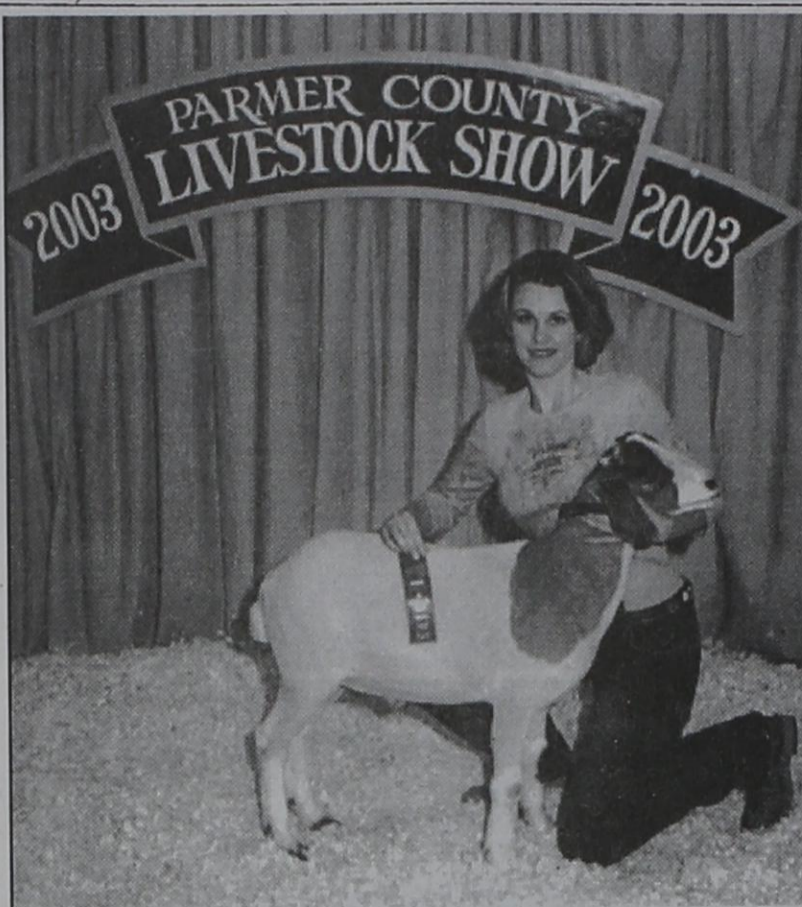
