WASHINGTON, Nov. 23. (AP)—The War Department announced Tuesday the transfer of Brigadier General Jonathan M. Wainwright, now commander of Fort Myer, Va., to command of the First Cavalry Brigade, Fort Clark, Texas. The transfer is effective December 11.
Other orders directed Brigadier General Robert C. Richardson, Jr., who commands the Second Cavalry Brigade, Fort Bliss, Texas, to take command of the cavalry school, Fort Riley, Kan.
General Richardson's orders are effective February 1, upon retirement of Brigadier General Guy V. Henry, present commandant of the cavalry school.
