"MY TURN"

THERE'S A LAW (Murphy's Law) that says: If a tornado is going to hit your town, it must do so on a Friday evening about an hour after the weekly newspaper publisher has just gotten his papers out in the mail and into the newsracks around town. That way it will be a whole week before he can get photos and articles about the disaster into the next issue of the paper. By that time, everyone in the area already knows that Friona suffered a terrible tornado.

A "friend" of mine, who shall remain nameless, said "This is the biggest news story to blow into town in a long time." Bill said we didn't need a big news story that bad. We prefer to report on nice, normal, homey news items such as good rainfall, the Bike-A-Thon, summer school, donations to the Fire Department, retiring teachers receiving their silver trays, etc.

I'm glad that our children came up from Lubbock to see what happened to their old hometown. They all remarked about how lucky the Ellises were to have had only some concrete blocks thrown into the yard and some roof and fence damage. I told them the reason we weren't worse off was because we are such "good people" but I don't think they were convinced.

The really good people were all out helping each other, lending a hand toward the clean-up and repairs necessary to get life back to normal. It sort of reaffirms your faith in the goodness of mankind when you see how hard the various crews worked all weekend to restore services to the people of Friona.

All the things you CANNOT do when the power is off for 21 hours (east side of Friona) is pretty amazing. First of all, you can't call your kids long-distance to let them know you're okay. A bologna sandwich is about the best you can do for supper with no stove, microwave, can opener, coffee pot, etc. You might run to one of the local drive-ins for a burger and fries, except they were all closed. . .no lights, no heat for cooking, no cash registers, etc.

Four of the local homebound folks who are oxygen dependent were brought up to the hospital since the portable oxygen tanks only hold about two and a half hours' worth with the power off. Throughout the weekend, the Home Health people checked on others of the homebound who live alone, so they wouldn't be frightened.

Candles, matches, flashlights and batteries suddenly become your best friends on a dark and stormy night when the power is out. You can read for awhile by flashlight, but those rechargeable things only stay on for about an hour. Now I know why people had such large families back before there were electric lights, radio, TV, etc. There simply wasn't much else to do after the sun went down.

We couldn't get the cars out of our garage because the door opener wouldn't work and our wooden double door is too heavy to pull up manually, so Bill and I were housebound until some friends came by to drive us around.

Saturday morning we discovered about half of Friona was in Bovina having breakfast at the restaurant, picking up a few provisions at the store, and getting gas for their vehicles, since, with no power, Friona's gas pumps were all inoperable.

After looking over the various homes that were demolished, Hi-Pro, the airport, the cemetery, I was reminded of what Dana Bradley said. She was the young woman who was buried in the ruins when the Oklahoma City Federal Building was bombed and had her leg amputated before she could be brought out of the wreckage. Plus she lost her mother and two little children.

"Never take anything for granted," Dana said. "Treat everything you have, even your parents, like precious china, because someday it could all be gone in a flash."

Bovina Volunteers Assist At Friona

The tornado that damaged Friona, Friday, June 2, brought volunteer emergency response from many area towns and cities.

Among the first to reach the scene were members of the Bovina Volunteer Emergency Medical Service (EMS) and the Bovina Volunteer Fire Department.

Larry Mitchell, EMS Director, and Richard Bonham, Fire Chief, led a group of certified volunteers to assist in the aftermath of the tornado destruction. More than ten volunteers responded.

According to Donna Mitchell, wife of EMS Director Larry Mitchell, and herself a certified emergency medical technician, the first call for assistance came in around 7PM.

The teams left immediately, arriving at the Excel plant on the west side of Friona.

A check with Excel personnel proved that no serious injuries were suffered by Excel employees.

Next, the Bovina volunteers were summoned to south Friona, which had sustained heavy damage to both businesses and the residential area.

After treating some minor injuries there, Bovina's volunteers were sent to Hi-Pro Feeds, one of the most heavily damaged facilities by the tornado.

At Hi-Pro, said Donna Mitchell, they transported one victim to the Friona hospital. The young man had been briefly buried in heavy dust from the Hi-Pro mill and was taken to the hospital as a precaution.

In an ironic twist, the young man's mother worked at the hospital and was not aware that her son was a tornado victim.

The ambulance crew then drove around Friona, looking for people who needed assistance, and assuring that all injuries had been reported and treated. They ended the evening working with Parmer County Community Hospital in triage, processing minor injuries and assisting with paperwork.

Mrs Mitchell observed that there were very few injuries when you consider the massive damage done to the area. The EMS and Fire crews returned to Bovina around 10 p.m.

Gabe Anderson Is Honored At A&M

Gabe Anderson, Jr. of Bovina was a recipient of this year's Distinguished Alumni Award at Texas A&M University's commencement exercises recently.

The award recipient is selected by Texas A&M's Former Students Association for professional achievements, contributions to society, leadership and stature.

Anderson, a member of the Texas A&M Class of 1941, is a recognized leader in the grain elevators, farming, ranching and oil and gas industries. After receiving marketing and finance degrees, he was commissioned 2nd Lt. and assigned to the 1st Armored Division where he earned Silver and Bronze Stars during World War II.

Returning home in 1947, Anderson established the Sherley-Anderson-Pitman Grain Co. in Bovina and directed a 200,000 bushel grain elevator. The firm now runs five elevator operations with over 22 million bushels capacity. Anderson also operates several thousand acres of irrigated farm land in Texas and New Mexico.

In the 1960s, he expanded his interest to include oil and gas explorations. He later helped create, then sold, the 38,000 head Parmer County Feed Yard. In 1980, he acquired New Mexico's Cross L Ranch which he has expanded into Colorado.

A director of FirstBank Southwest of Amarillo, Anderson has served on four bank boards. He is a former president of the Panhandle Grain & Feed Assn. and Texas Grain & Feed Assn., which awarded him the coveted Lone Star Award in 1987. He also served on the National Grain & Feed Board.

He was president of the 12th Man Foundation formerly of the Aggie Club in 1987 and serves on Texas A&M's College of Business Development Council and the Chancellor's 21st Century Council. In 1994, he was inducted into the Lettermen's Hall of Honor at Texas A&M.

The home health nurse acts as a liaison between the patient and

physician. "I'm very pleased with the services we have here in Friona and would highly recommend it to other area residents," stated Mrs. Miller.

In addition to skilled nursing care by Registered and Vocational Nurses, Certified Nurse Aides are available to assist with personal care and light housekeeping tasks. Other services provided are physical therapy, wound care, I.V. therapy, respiratory, diabetic care, medication maintenance and a variety of others.

First BB Camp Set In Bovina

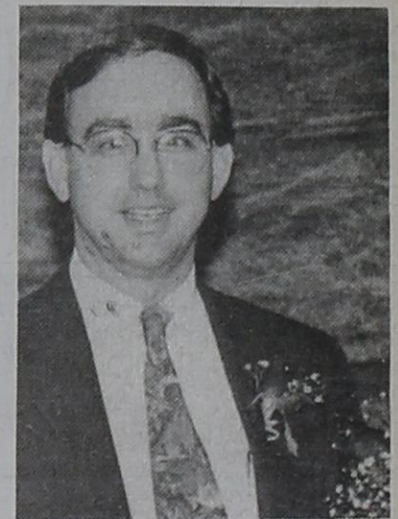
The first annual Bovina Basketball Camp will be held June 19-23 for boys and girls in the second through fourth grades.

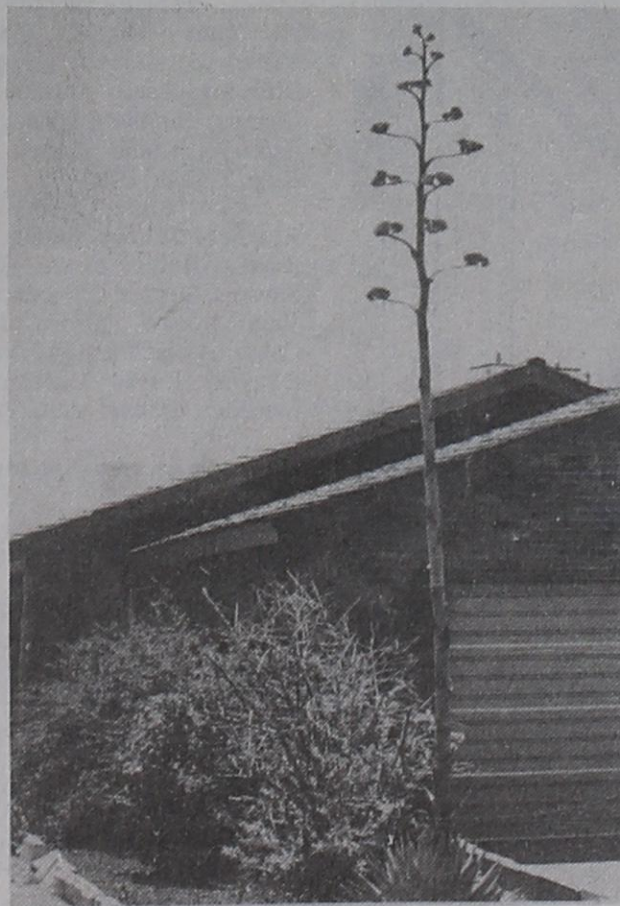


STEVE VENABLE S. Venable Is Seminary Graduate

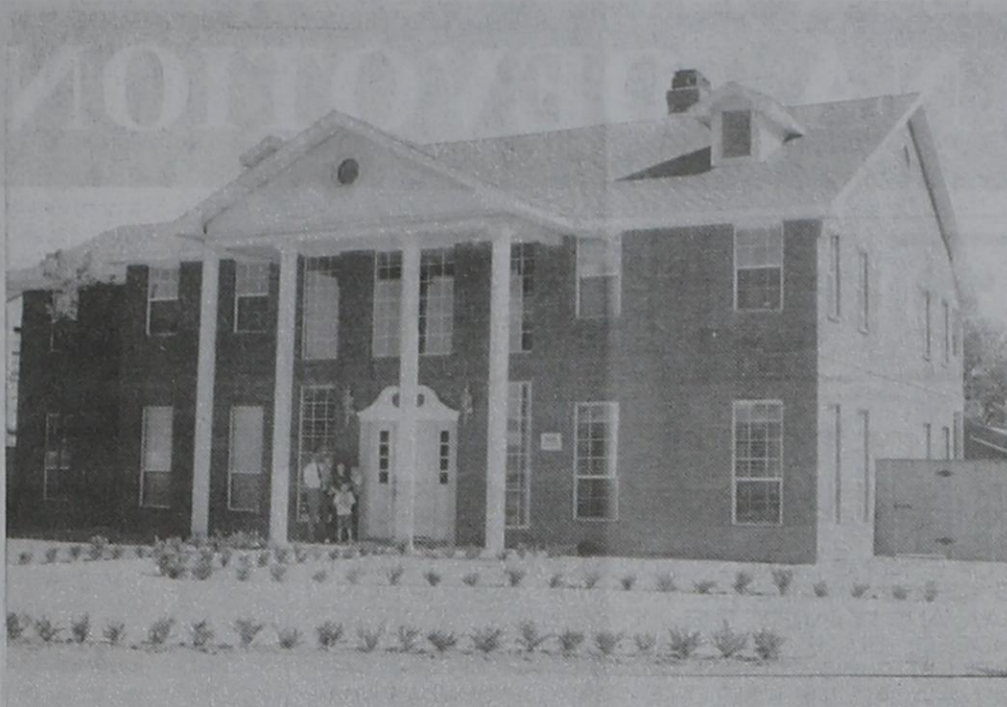
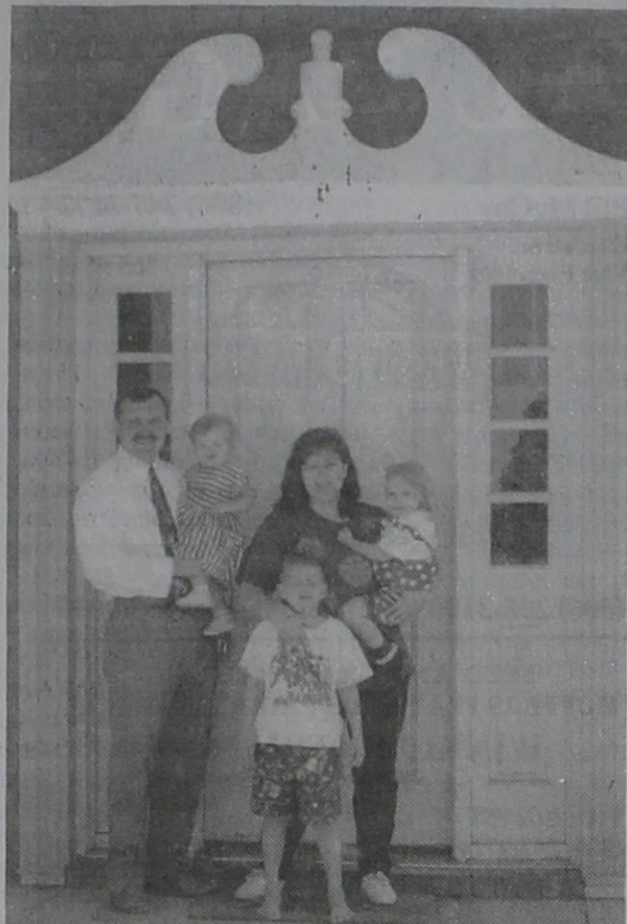

Woodrow House Opens In Lubbock

On Friday, April 28, David and Dawn Fleming of Lubbock saw their dream come true when their Bed and Breakfast opened for the first time.

The Woodrow House, a bed and breakfast located in Lubbock at the corner of 19th and Boston, is the culmination of four years of dreaming, planning, researching and designing by David and Dawn.

The Woodrow House is the first permanent structure built on the corner lot at 19th Street and Boston Avenue. The land was first deeded by the State of Texas via Patent No. 457, Vol. 30 dated August 2, 1878.

It's interesting to think that this one lot, deeded over one hundred years ago, has remained vacant over the years. The lot is a prime location to almost everything in Lubbock.

And, if you've ever noticed all those big mansions on "mansion row" on 19th Street, the new structure is a perfect complement to the aristocratic beauty found in that area.

Woodrow House is named after David's paternal grandfather, George Woodrow Fleming (1914-1972). Woodrow "Woody" Fleming was a Texas rancher, agribusinessman, cotton ginner, grain merchant and entrepreneur. David is the son of Howard and Pat Fleming of Friona.

Some of you might remember David as one of Friona High School's mile-relay state qualifiers in 1980. David is currently employed by Westar Commercial Realty as a commercial real estate broker in Lubbock.

Located directly across from

Texas Tech University, Woodrow House is within walking distance to virtually all university events and activities. Because of its convenient location, David and Dawn have already had many guests stay in their home. Texas Tech graduation ceremonies brought in quite a few guests to the manor. David mentioned that the weekend of Texas Tech's first 1995 football game is already booked, and they continue to get reservations for selected times.

Woodrow House has five rooms available, all with private baths. The rooms are decorated according to their names and include the Victorian Room, the President's Room, the 50s Room, the Alumni Room and the Equestrian Room. The third floor to the mansion has two unfinished rooms that will eventually enable the home to offer seven available rooms. The private area of the home has three bedrooms on the second floor.

As the name implies, the Victorian Room is decorated in a Victorian style with a solid cherry bedroom suite dated to the 1880s. The bath has an antique claw foot tub. The President's Room is dedicated to the men who have held our nation's highest office. The bedroom suite is solid mahogany. This room boasts a private entrance off the back porch and a double shower in the bath.

The 50s room has a private door to the balcony overlooking the large back yard. The 1950s decor brings back the memories that made the 50s so unique in American culture. The Equestrian Room is home to a bedroom suite purchased by Woodrow Fleming in 1947 from

Sears Roebuck and Co. in Wichita Falls. The decor is dedicated to the horse and its contributions to the American way of life.

The Alumni Room overlooks Texas Tech from the second floor. The oak and mahogany bedroom suite includes a custom built king-size bed. Patrons will also notice copies of the Flemings' cookbook, "Raider Recipes."

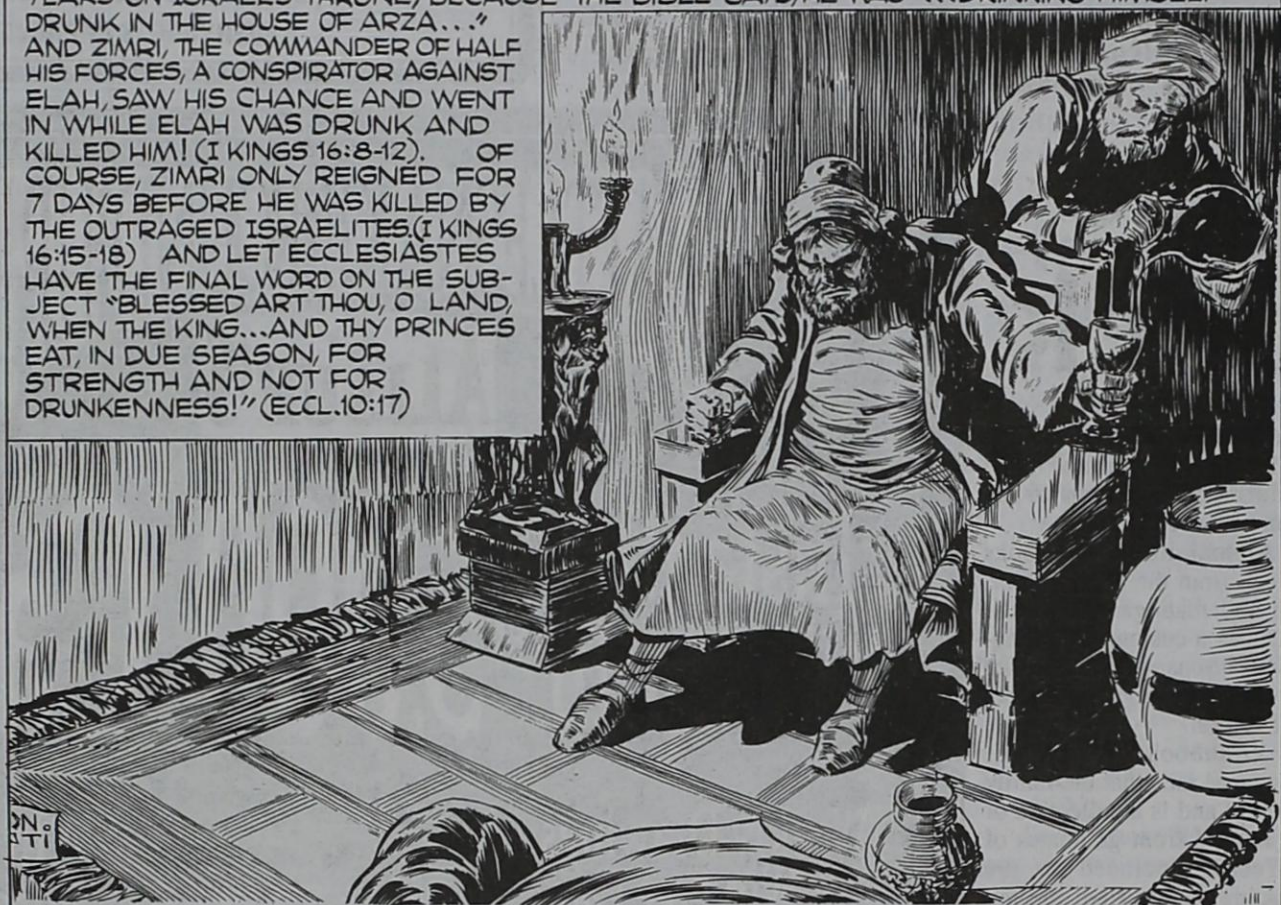
