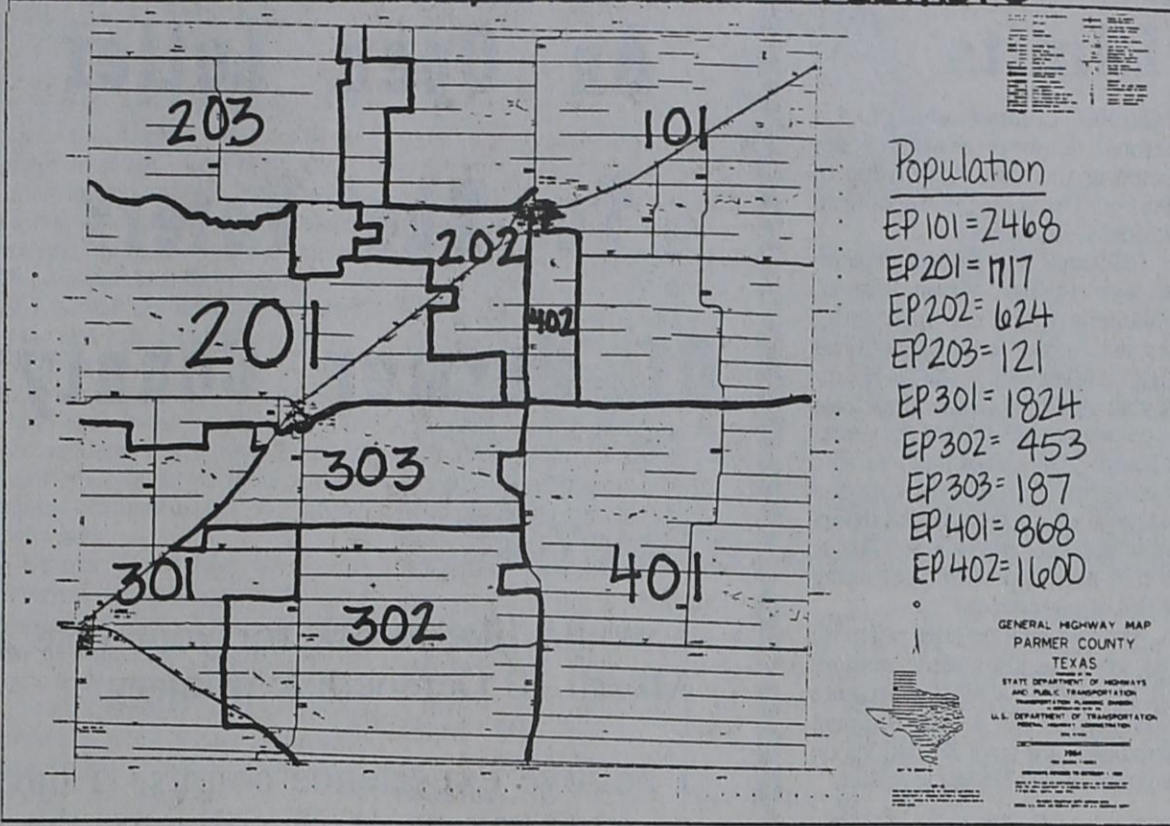

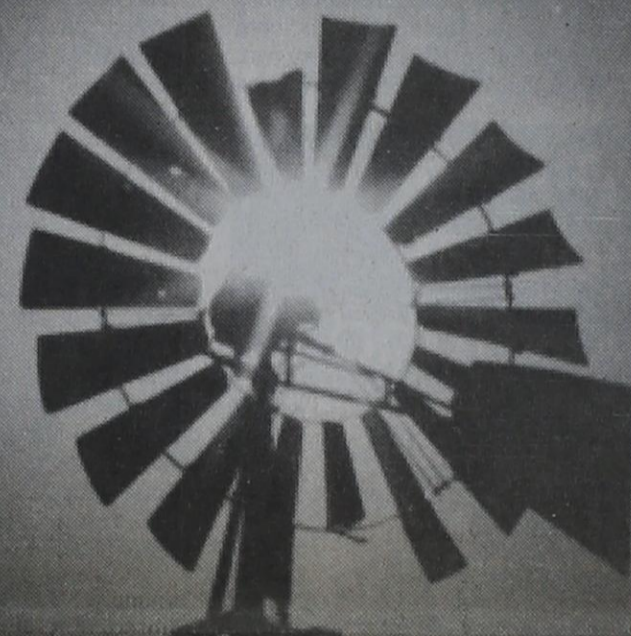

County Demo. Chairman Urges Support For Pair

Parmer County Democratic Party Chairman Wendol Christian urges Democrats to work to elect Guerrero and Overstreet.

Parmer County Democratic Chairman Wendol Christian asks all Democrats to vote for Railroad Commissioner Lena Guerrero and Court of Appeals Judge Morris Overstreet in the March 10 primary election.

"It's important that all Parmer County Democratic voters know that Lena Guerrero and Morris Overstreet are the only qualified candidates in their races," Christian said. "It's my job as county chairman to be sure all Parmer County voters know the truth about these qualified office-holders and their opponents who are running on famous or familiar-sounding names," Christian added.

"As county chairman, I don't usually get involved in state primary elections. But Lena Guerrero and Morris Overstreet are qualified office-holders running against candidates with nothing going for them except famous, recognizable names," he said.

As chairman of the Railroad Commission, Lena Guerrero has earned praise for her fresh, problem-solving approach to improving our economy. She has been endorsed by over 200 local and state office-holders, the other two railroad commissioners and major newspapers ranging from the Dallas Morning News to the Amarillo Globe-News.

"Morris Overstreet has been the most active, efficient and effective judge on the Court of Criminal Appeals. The State Bar poll found 58.5 per cent of all lawyers said Morris Overstreet was the most qualified candidate among all

Democrats and Republicans in the race, the highest total for any statewide judge," Christian said.

"Judge Overstreet has been endorsed by every major newspaper that has endorsed in the race. His bar poll standing shows respect for his judicial abilities by all attorneys, not just Democrats," Christian observed.

"His opponent, Gene Kelly hopes that having the name of a famous dancer will elect him and that's not what we need on our highest criminal court," the county leader said.

Morris Overstreet and Lena Guerrero are excellent leaders and qualified office-holders. Their election is important for the Democratic Party and for the people of Texas," Christian said. "I urge Parmer County voters to support them in the March 10 Democratic primary," he concluded.

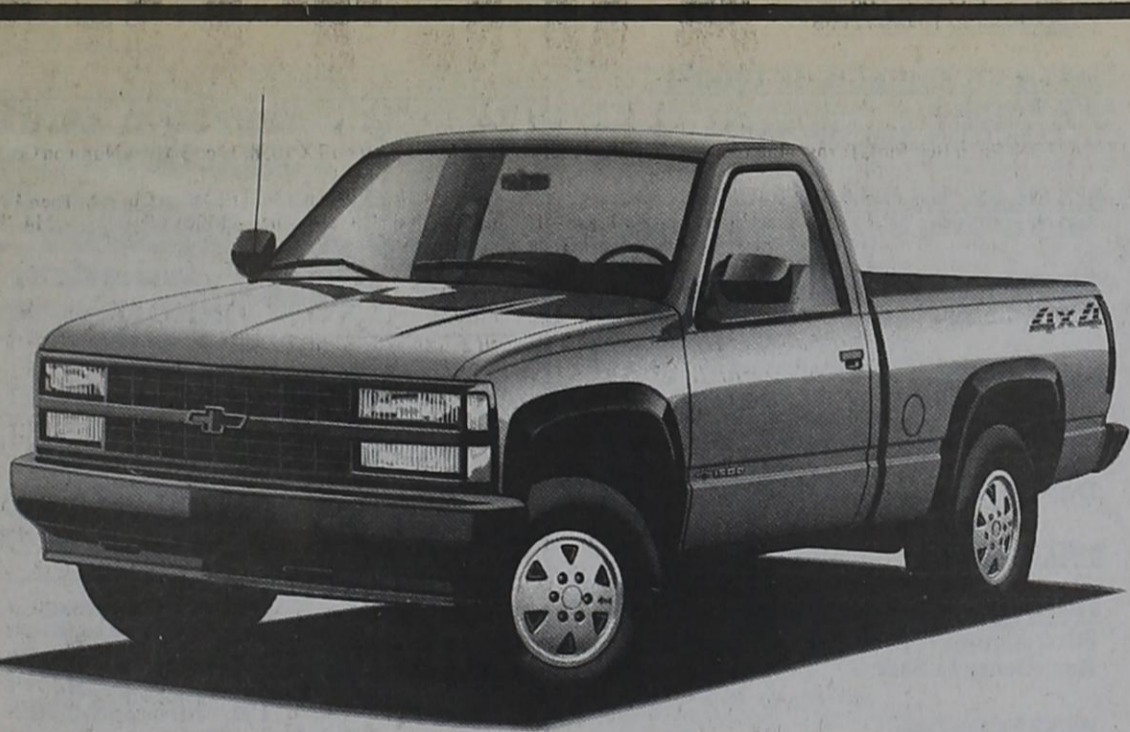

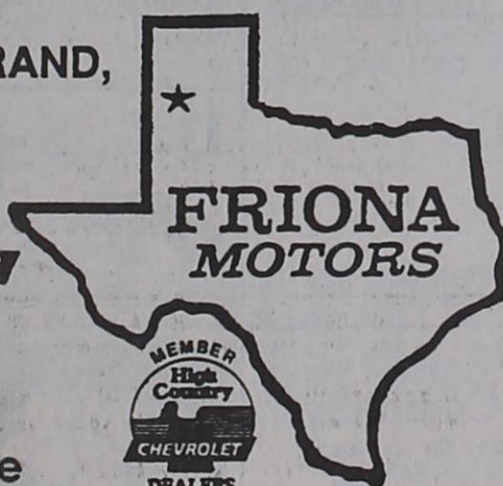

HIS MOTHER, MARY, WAS A WOMAN OF WEALTH, IN WHOSE HOME IN JERUSALEM, MARK MET ST. PETER WHO WAS A CONSTANT VISITOR. MARK ACCOMPANIED HIS COUSIN BARNABAS AND ST. PAUL ON MISSIONARY TRIPS AS AN ASSISTANT. AFTER THEIR DEATHS, HE ATTACHED HIMSELF TO PETER, FOR WHOM HE WORKED AS A LETTER WRITER AND INTERPRETER DUE TO GALILEAN-BORN PETER'S LACK OF PROFICIENCY IN GREEK AND ROMAN SPEECH.

BECAUSE MARK WROTE HIS GOSPEL WHILE AT ROME WITH PETER, MANY AUTHORITIES FELT IT WAS DONE WHOLLY UNDER PETER'S GUIDANCE—THE ANCIENT CLEMENT OF ALEXANDRIA THOUGHT SO, AS DID PAPIAS, BUT....

...WHETHER THIS IS SO OR NOT, HE WROTE WITH GREAT INDEPENDENCE! MANY THINGS CAN BE LEARNED FROM MARK THAT ARE NOT FOUND IN THE OTHER GOSPELS—FIRST, HE DID NOT WRITE HIS GOSPEL FOR THE JEWS BUT FOR THE GENTILE CONVERTS TO CHRISTIANITY....

...THIS IS EVIDENT IN HIS MANNER OF TAKING TIME TO EXPLAIN CERTAIN THINGS WHICH NEEDED NO EXPLAINING TO JEWS—SUCH AS THE FACT THE "JORDAN IS A RIVER," THE PHARISEES "USED TO FAST," THE MOUNT OF OLIVES IS "OVER AGAINST THE TEMPLE," AT PASSOVER MEN "EAT UNLEAVENED BREAD"—MARK ALSO TOOK THE TROUBLE TO POINT OUT THAT MATTHEW WAS "LEVI, SON OF ALPHEUS, PETER WAS A NAME GIVEN TO SIMON BY JESUS, THAT JESUS WAS A "CARPENTER"!
