over the hearings, Fulgencio Ortiz of Farwell and Barty Bartlett of Bovina were bound over for grand
jury action. jury action.
The two men were involved with separate cases dealing with viola-
tions of marijuana laws. Ortiz was arrested and charged with felony possession marijuana following an sponsored by the City of Farwell.
Bartlett was charged with
possession of marijuana over four possession of marijuana over four
ounces following the discovery of a marijuana field growing 12 miles north of Farwell. Similar charges
