Compared
With Area

Last week, the Blade ran a
article on the raise in the schoo araxes. This week, a more detailed
report is being published report is being published.
As was stated in the last As was stated in the last issue, the
Board of Education voted to raise the school taxes by 30 per cent for the school year 1978-79. This
increase is hoped to help offset the increase is hoped to help offset the
money needed to begin the nex money needed to begin the nex
school year and the additiona money it takes to run the schoo district caused by inflation.
A thirteen year history of the A thirteen year history of the tax
rate is as follows: From 1966-67 until 1972-73, the rate was $331-3$ per cen assessed value and $\$ 1.65$ per
hundred. In 1973-74, the tax rate was increased to $331-3$ per cent assessed value at $\$ 1.83$ per hundred.
In 1975-76, the tax rate was
In 1975-76, the tax rate was again
increased to 50 per cent assessed value at $\$ 1.59$ per hundred. In
1976- 77 , the tax rate decreased to 1976- -77 , the tax rate decreased to
s.73 per hundred at 100 per cent assessed value. This year, the tax
rate will be $\$ .95$ per hundred at 100 per cent assessed value. There have been three increases and one
decrease in the past thirteen years.
The Blade contacted some of the surrounding school districts to obtain their tax rates so as to
provide a comparision for the provide a comparision for the
readers. The Friona Schoo District's tax rate is $\$ .621 / 2$ per
hundred at 100 per cent of the hundred at 100 per cent of the
assessed value. The Lazbuddie assessed value. The Lazbuddie
School District's tax rate is $\$ 1.20$ per hundred at 48 per cent of the
assessed value. The Farwell School assessed value. The Farwell School District's tax rate is $\$ 1.60$ per
hundred at 100 per cent of the assessed value.

$\$ 10,000.00$ assessed value would compute to the following figures:

The fire department has had vehicle suitable for ambulance us

needed equipment for state certification. Earlier this year an
ambulance cot complete with ambulance cot complete with
tie-down bars and jump seat for the tie-down bars and jump seat or thant was obtained through a permanent loan from the Ralls
Ambulance Service. Work is now underway to install

effective this September and effective this
September, 1979.
The new requirements for
September 1978 are: all students under 12 years old must have had
red measles illness shot during or after the month of
their first birthd their first birthday.
The children in
The children in Bovina schools
who don't meet this requirement
have been notified and notes sent have been notified, and
home to their parents.
There are more new requirements
for September 1979, and parents for September 1979, and parents
may wish to take note in preparation. 1. Children in kindergarten and
first grade must have mumps first grade must have mumps
vaccine or present a doctor's vaccine or present a doctor's
statement that they have had
mumps illness. mumps illness. 2. Before September 1, 1979, a
report of red measles or mumps report of red measles or mumps
illness is acceptable from the parents or guardian, and will
remain accepted through the remain accepted through the
student's school years. After September l, 1979, all new reports of red measles or mumps illness must
be verified by a doctor's written be verified
statement.
If parents have questions or would like more explanation, they may call
the superintendent's office and leave a phone number. The school nurse will return the calls on Thursday and
Friday. Friday.

to break up the problem and that
crowd that had gathered, $35-40$ persons, were beginning to get unruly, Atchley then cailed for assistance as it appeared there Henry Minter and Bob Davis and D.P.S. Trooper Jim Bishop responded to the call and the crowd was
dispersed without further incidents. One girl and Officer Atchley went to Parmer County Community Hospital for treatment of cuts and both were released.
Investigations are still being
conducted conducted at this time.
