The Bigger Task Ahead
The hysteria of jubilation-natural, inevitable and
spontaneous sequence to Japanese surrender-has sub-
sided.
And returning once more to the foremost position in
the consciousness of the American and Allied peoples is
their solemn realization, which was crowded into the back-
ground momentarily, of the responsibilities and problems
imposed by the restoration of peace.
The collapse of Japan paced the final official stamp
of triumph upon the most difficult and dangerous problem
of war ever to be faced by free peoples of the earth. The
issue long was in doubt. For months and years it took
highest courage even to hope that human liperty could
survive the threat to its existence. But it has survived
after the greatest victory in the greatest war recorded in
history
Democratic peoples now have crossed the threshold
of another era. And they are confronted with problems
and difficulties of peace no less in magnitude than the
problems of war which have just been mastered. Most
thinking peope are filled with the realization that to gain
victory in peace likely will be fully as difficult-and may victory in peace likely will be fully as difficult-and may

done. But common sense must tell us that, just as victory

may be. But logic should tell everyone that he will have
to give, perhaps a great deal, in return for the blessings
he expects to receive for himself and his posterity.
There still is a job-an enormous job- for individuals
as well as for nations. No one knows as yet the specifice
nature of the job ahead. But there is bright hope in the
belief that. in individuals as a whole accept their part of
that job with the same enthusiasm and determination they
accepted their duties in war, then free mankind will gain
a greater vietory in peace than he did in war.

Texas' phenomenal growth during recent years has brought a heavy demand upon the state's highest court. The last. legislature proposea an amendment to the state constifution which would make our court comparable to that of other states in the population bracket of the great Lone Star.

It will give a voice to all nine judges who now hear arguments and write opinions, but upon which only three are empowered to rule.
It will require a majority of five judges for court rulings, instead of two as at present. It will require five for a quorum, instead of the present two.
It will prevent the possibility of two judges handing down an opinion which might be entirely different to that held by one of the present three judges and all six of the court-appointed appeals commissioners.
It will enable the people of Texas to choose all of the men who serve on this court, with election of three each two years for six-year terms. Today one judge is elected each two years, with two Commissioners being appointed at the same time for six-year terms.

Lawyers are urging their clients and friends to vote for this amendment. Because we believe the people should have the added efficiency which the action

## Secretary of Agricuiture Sees Increased Household Fat Salvage As Aid To Meeting Needs

"The scarcity of fats and oils is one of the most serious problems confronting our Nation. But it is one shortage which the women of America can help to meet.
"There is little hope of major improvement in the domestic supply of fats and oils in the near future, nor can we expect a rapid increase of imported oils from the Pacific.
"Farmers have responded to the call to produce more animal and vegetable fats and oils. But we are still unable to meet wartime demands.
"During the war years we have changed from an importing to an exporting nation on fats and oils. Our domestic
stocks are at a low ebb and our war, industrial and relief needs are at a peak.
"In 1945 we need $250,000,000$ pounds of used household fats to help fill our existing deficit. If American Housewives don't meet this goal, we will have to further curtail the allotments for civilian, industrial and military uses.
"This is an important job for women! Homemakers all over the land-in cities, towns and villages, and on farmsshould save and turng in every available drop of used kitchefat. It means cash and extra red ration points.
"But above all, it's a real War Service women can I form for themselves and for their country."
