(AP)—The radio at Caracas, capital of Venezuela, announced Friday a rebellion had broken out in Venezuela and that "all armed forces remain loyal to the government except a very small minority" of officers.

Fragmentary and conflicing reports from the Caracas radio said the revolters seized the garrison at Miraflores, Caracas suburb, and the military school.

There reports declared "demo-cratic forces" had silenced a radio station used by the rebels. One broadcast said the rebels claimed to have the support of former President Gen. Eleazor Lopez Contreras, one of the candidates in Venezuela's current presidential campaign, but that this claim was



to conduct strike votes if unions give 30 days notice. Tracy did not advocate repeal of other sections of the

Lesson Of The Ifs

As the full history of the second World War begins to be told, the word IF looms up in increasingly large and terrifying proportions. Only now are we beginning to realize by how thin a thread this country's eventual victory hung during some of the crucial and secret moments

General Marshall, in his biennial report, has told of some of the larger ifs. If Britain and Russia had not held out with stubborn courage against overwhelming odds, if the unco-ordinated Axis countries had not made a series of, by now, classic errors, the story might have been tragi-

And there were other, smaller ifs-fateful, providential happenings that are both humbling and frightening. If, in 1934, an Italian physicist had used a piece of tinfoil one-thousandth of an inche thick, instead of threethousandths, in one of his experiments, he would have discovered the technique of atomic fission and the secret of the atom bomb would have belonged to the Axis.

Hitler might still have had the secret if his bigotry had not driven him to deport a "non-Aryan" woman scientist just as she was about to find the key which did unlock the atom for us.

If a young English woman had not guessed that the black and white blurs on an air photograph of a German town were an airplane and its launching ramp, the Vweapon experimental base at Peenemuende might not have been bombed in time to thrwart the rocket missiles'

Perhaps even if the British had not found an actor in their army who remarkably resembled Marshal Montgomery, and had not sent him to North Africa where Axis spies saw him a few days before D-Day, the invasion of the continent might have found the enemy fully alert.

These ifs may carry the inescapable conclusion that God was on the side of the right, and not always of the strongest battalions. But we Americans cannot forever be content to trust in divine intervention. We might also recall that "God helps those that help themselves," and then give heed to our military leaders' counsel on the need for national preparedness in the future.

General Marshall is not the first of these leaders to rive such counsel. But none has given it with more wis His words on the subject, of which the following are a brief sample, should be given serious thought by every mature American, as a guide toward a national policy which the people will decide:

"We have tried since the birth of our nation to promote our love of peace by a display of weakness. This course . . . cost us millions of lives and billions of treasure.

"It will be said that to protect itself this nation need only rely on its machine power, that it will not need manpower. . . . The folly of the Maginot Lines was proved early in the war, but too late to save France.

"We finish each bloody war with a feeling of acute revulsion against this savage form of human behavior, and yet on each occasion we confuse military preparedness with the causes of war and then drift almost deliberately into another catastrophe."

Terror Weapon

The New York Herald-Tribune reports that the Japanese invasion plans included the use of luminous painted foxes, which were to have been turned loose in the dark to scare the Japs, who consider the fox the incarnation of

The Jap surrender forestalled use of this weapon of terror dreamed up by American Intelligence but we wonder if skunks, with or without luminous pain, wouldn't have worked just as well.



Enlisted Pacific GIs Accuse Army Of Not Using Shipping Space

MANILA -(AP)- U. S. enlisted men in the Philippines, writing in the "Letters Column" of the Army newspaper Daily Pacifican, accuse Army authorities supervising the homeward shipment of veterans of stalling, inefficiency and promise-

The writers complained that the Army was failing to make use of dozens of cargo vessels sailing empty for the United States. They said they sailed in these ships in various Pacific landings, and described as "phoney" the Army's solicitude for their comfort now. Recently Army officials said reighters were unsuitable for deploying troops home, but one letter

said: "Give us a case of ten-in-one rations and we will be tickled to death to ride cargo ships home." Says Liberty Ships OK Friday morning's issue of the Pacifican quoted Col. C. H. Davidson, superintendent of the Water Division, Port of Manila, as saying

he could put Liberty ships in shape to carry 75 troops each, some with 48 hours' work by 50 men. "It's been done before," said Davidson. "If the ships are allocated, I can have each one ready to carry 75 troops back to the

United States in comparatively good living conditions within 48 hours if I can have 50 men to work on each of them.' Veterans in the Philippines also complained that the Army was violating its promises to send home the highest point men first. They said the policy of sending divisions
