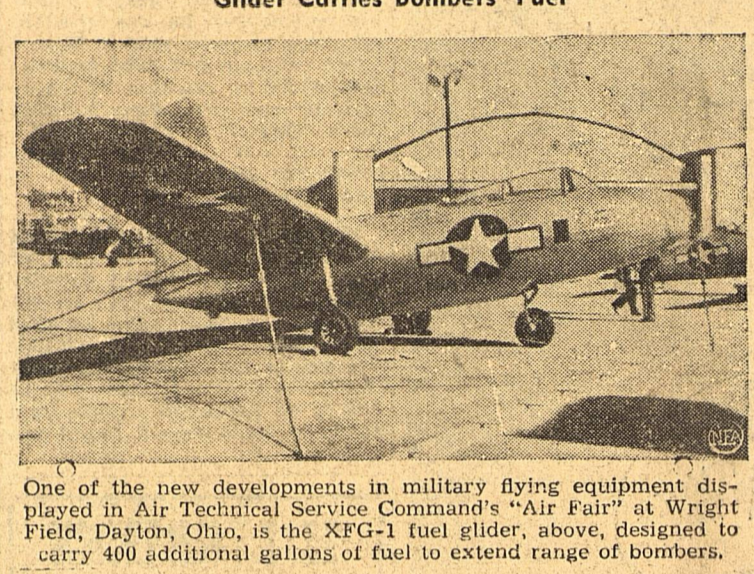
S-E Extension Is Staked To Welch Pool In Dawson

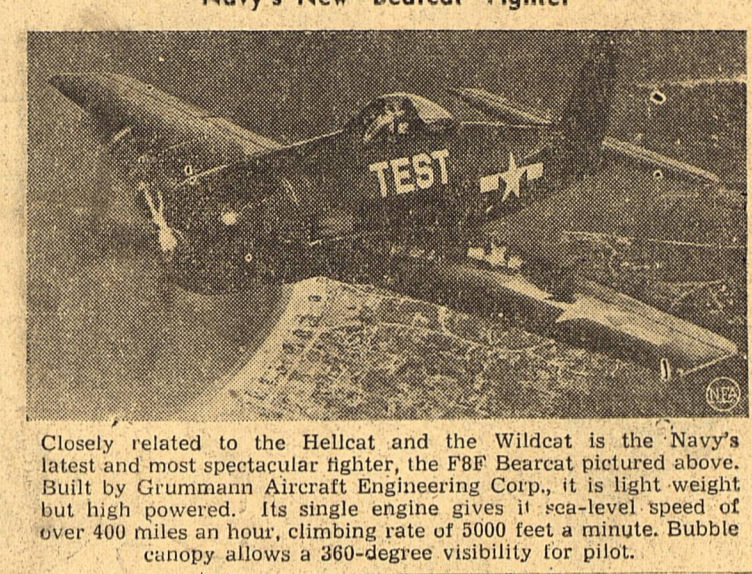

Navy's New 'Bearcat' Fighter



Closely related to the Hellcat and the Wildcat is the Navy's latest and most spectacular fighter, the F8F Bearcat pictured above. Built by Grumman Aircraft Engineering Corp., it is light weight but high powered. Its single engine gives it sea-level speed of over 400 miles an hour, climbing rate of 5000 feet a minute. Bubble canopy allows a 360-degree visibility for pilot.

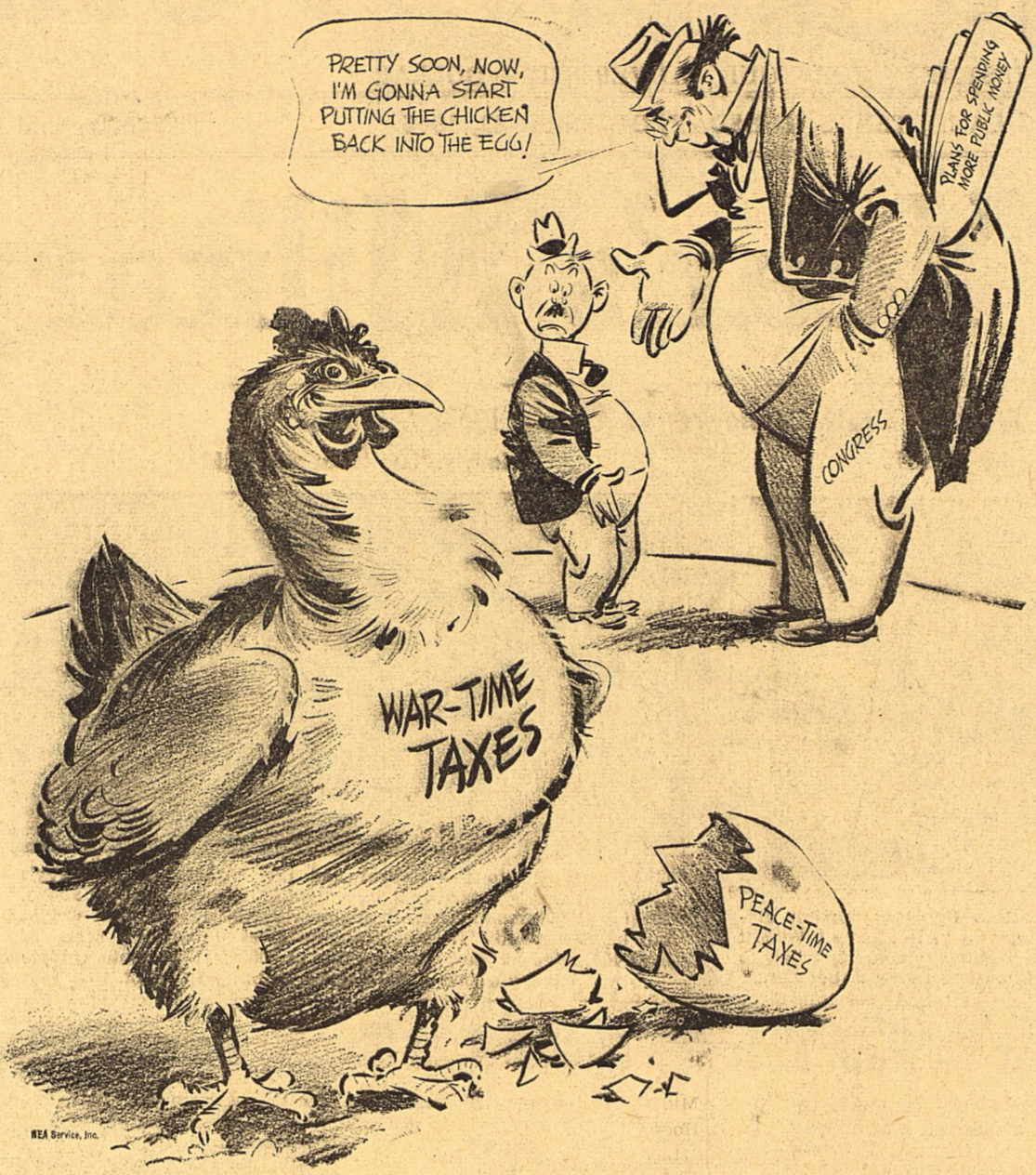

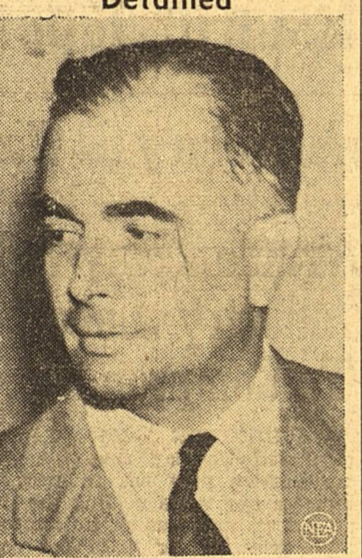

**PROCLAMATION**  
BY THE  
**Governor**

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME—GREETINGS!

WHEREAS, the American people have just brought to a victorious conclusion the most desperate and far-reaching conflict in our nation's history and the task ahead now is the maintenance, with the other United Nations, of world harmony based on the Four Freedoms, the building of a new and better world of peace and international good will and cooperation; and

WHEREAS, eternal vigilance, alertness and preparedness must be maintained against the possibility of any enemy seeking again to rise and strike against the peace won at the cost of so many American lives; and


WHEREAS, the Regular Army of the United States now offers our young men the opportunity to take action of the highest patriotic significance, to take the places of those who already have rendered long and hard service in day-to-day combat, to serve in the Army when we must maintain our national security with utmost caution; and

WHEREAS, this call for recruits is addressed to every man between the ages of 18 and 34 inclusive, those still in service, those who have recently left the service and those young men who soon will be eligible for service under the draft; and

WHEREAS, the State of Texas from the first has taken its place in the very forefront in the fighting of this war, giving generously of its sons who have sacrificed their lives in every theater of global combat, providing vastly of its resources in industry and the raw materials of war, so that it behoves this State to retain its place at the front in the winning of the peace:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Coke R. Stevenson, Governor of Texas, do hereby proclaim and earnestly bespeak the full-hearted support of all Texans in the movement to recruit a protective force composed of men with a deep desire to serve, men who wish not only to preserve the freedoms for which their fellow-Texans have died but also to defend their children, for all time to come, from the necessity of making like sacrifices.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF I have heretofore signed my name officially and caused the Seal of State to be affixed hereto at Austin, this tenth day of September, A. D. 1945.
