## Good Hunting Seen As Pheasants Debut

Thirty minutes before sunrise
Saturday, you can expect to see
hunters by the hundreds walking hunters by the hundreds walking
through fields of cover crops, through fields of cover crops,
searching for the elusive ringsearching for necked pheasant. That's when the 1993 pheasant
season officially begins. Hunting season officially begins. Hunting Sunday, December 26 .
Legal hunting hours are 30 minutes before sunrise until 30 minutes after sunset each day. Bag limits are two cock pheasants daily with four in possession, and one
foot must remain attached to the carcass until it reaches its final destination. Only cock pheasants are "fair game," hens are off limits to hunters.
Lucki, whe Warden Jerry Castro and Parmer Counties, said the pheasant prospects this year are as good or better than last year. "Populations in my three
