

Bovina High School's varsity basketball teams won a pair of games played New Year's Day at Three Way.

The Fillies won their game, 62-45, and the Mustangs followed with a 74-48 win.

The wins were the fourth of the season for both teams. The Mustangs have lost eight times and the Fillies nine.

The hometown Eagles grabbed the early lead in the girls' game, holding a 10-8 advantage at the end of the first quarter.

Donna Griggs had a good second quarter, hitting four field goals, and Teresa Stone scored six points for the Fillies as they went to intermission with a 24-17 lead.

Bovina's scoring slacked off in the third quarter, and Three Way pulled to within six points, 33-27 at the end of three periods.

The Eagles, with just five players suited up due to the holiday, began to wear out in the fourth quarter, and before it was over, their top scorer fouled out.

Miss Stone had a great final quarter, with two field goals and six of eight from the line. She took scoring honors for the Fillies with 22 points, Miss Griggs scored 17 and Keri Mitchell 13.

In the boys' game, Cain Neal started with three baskets for the Mustangs plus a pair of free throws and Bovina was clinging to an 18-15 first-quarter lead.

Corey Kirkpatrick and Kory Mitchell each had a pair of firstquarter baskets.

Juan Reyna scored a pair of baskets for Bovina in the second quarter, but Three Way outscored Bovina, 17-12 in the quarter to take a 32-30 halftime lead.
