by the Texas Legislature, all drivers must carry minimum liability coverage for medical expenses of
$\$ 10,000$ per person ( $\$ 20,000$ for two or more persons) and property damages of $\$ 5,000$. said troopers will accept as evidence of insurance coverage the policy for the vehicle being operated or a document issued by the insurance
company. "Such a document must contain a statement that the liability coverage
for the motor vehicle is the minimum prescribed by the law," Adams said. "The document must also include th name of the insured person name of the insured person, policy
period and policy number. This period and policy number. This
document may take the form of letter or a card, depending upon the preference of the insuring company."
Adams pointed out that DPS Adams pointed out that DPS troopers will be enforcing the
provisions of this law along highways
