#### Abstract

A tree standing alone adds a certain aesthetic quality to rural living. But quality to rural living. But trees and scrubs in a windbreak becomes a management tool that effects management tool that effects every aspect of the farm or ranch. homestead, near cattle or bordering cropland, multiple row windbreaks can act as silent partner to Parmer silent partner to Parmer County landowners. Utilizing windbreaks as a conservation tool is not a new concept. Millions of shelterbelts were planted across the rural great plains across the rural great plains in the 1930 's and 40 's to reduce the winds and hold down the soil. Sixty years later, many are still reducing erosion today. Windbrea to reducing soil erosion to reducing soil erosion, increase land value, crop yields and reduce livestock yields and reduce livestock weight loss and mortality. weight loss and mortality However, producing a high performance windbreak requires more than planting a line of trees. windbreak it is essential to establish: the protection needed, species adaptability to the planting region, and the dimension of the break. Generally, each trea row should be planted 20 feet apart, with 10 to 20 foot spacings between each tree row. Proper spacing prevents crowding, which reduces stress and therefore decreases insect and disease susceptibilty while extending the life of the windbreak. break design is recommended
