Sales Tax Receipts Are Down For Parmer Co.

Texas Comptroller Carole Keeton Rylander has delivered a total of \$184 million in monthly sales tax

payments to 1,097 Texas cities and 118 counties.

June sales tax rebates include local sales taxes collected in April and reported to the Comptroller's office in May.

Parmer County received \$20,639 for this period compared to \$22,641 same period in 1998.

Bovina received \$1,730; Farwell, \$3,104; and Friona, \$15,804. The amounts represent an approximately 25% decrease for Bovina and Farwell and about 2% for Friona.

Total receipts so far in 1999 for the County are \$152,320, compared to \$180,709 same period last year, an average decrease of 15.7% in year-to-date receipts.

Area Received Nice Rain Last Friday

The Friona-Bovina area received a nice, soaking rain last Friday evening into early Saturday. The measurement was 1.50 at Friona, and 1.25 at Bovina.

Some farmers reported up to four inches. The Black area had the largest totals, but the higher readings were not general.

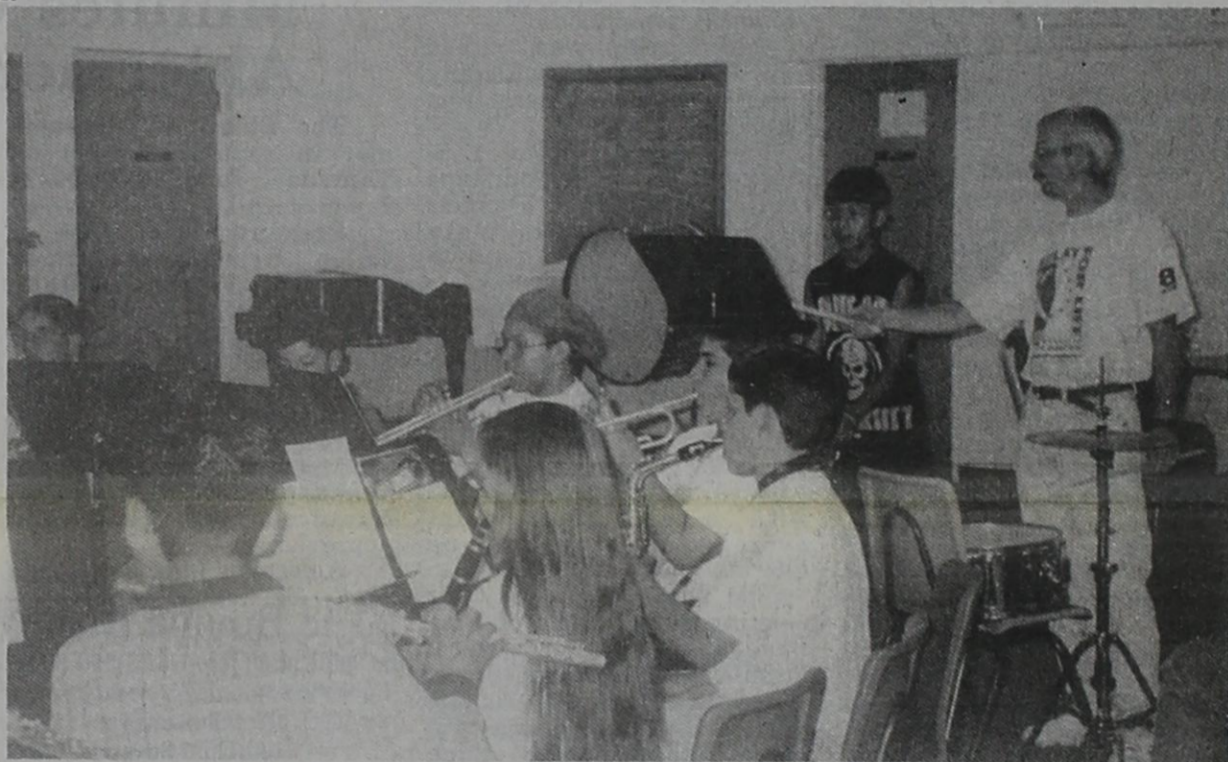
Luckily, the immediate area missed out on more bad hail, which has plagued parts of the Panhandle this spring.

The week's total makes 2.08 inches for the month, and brings the year's total to 10.91 inches. While we're not threatening the tropics yet, this is a tremendous gain of 6.86 inches over the same time period in 1998.

At this time a year ago, area farmers, gardeners and lawn-waterers were suffering through a three-month period that yielded only .69 inches for May-June-July combined.

Temperatures have been on the mild side, with highs in the 70s three days.

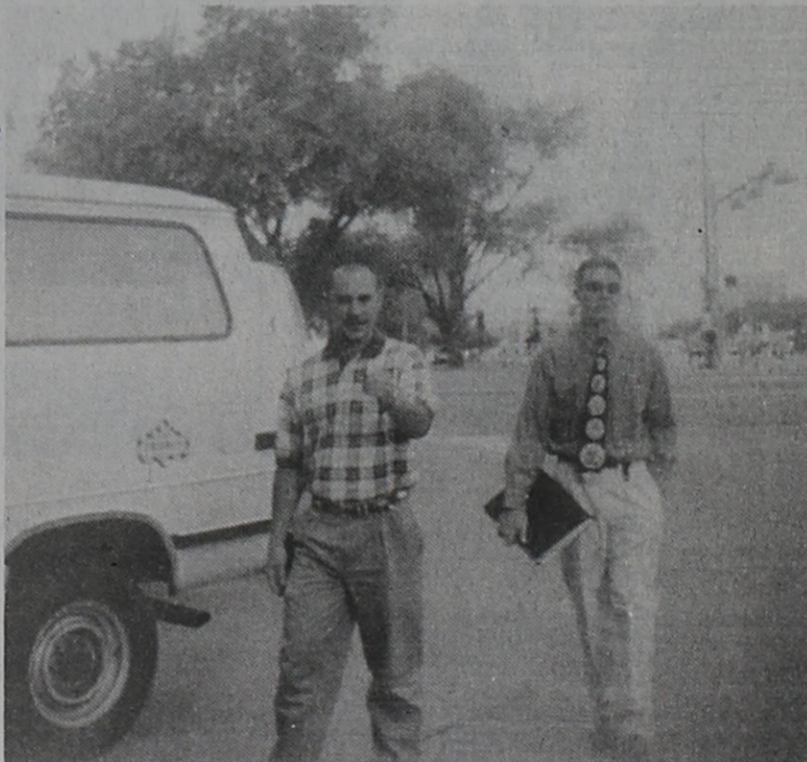

Anita Guest was the winner of \$1,000 from Bovina Supermarket through the Monopoly promotion.

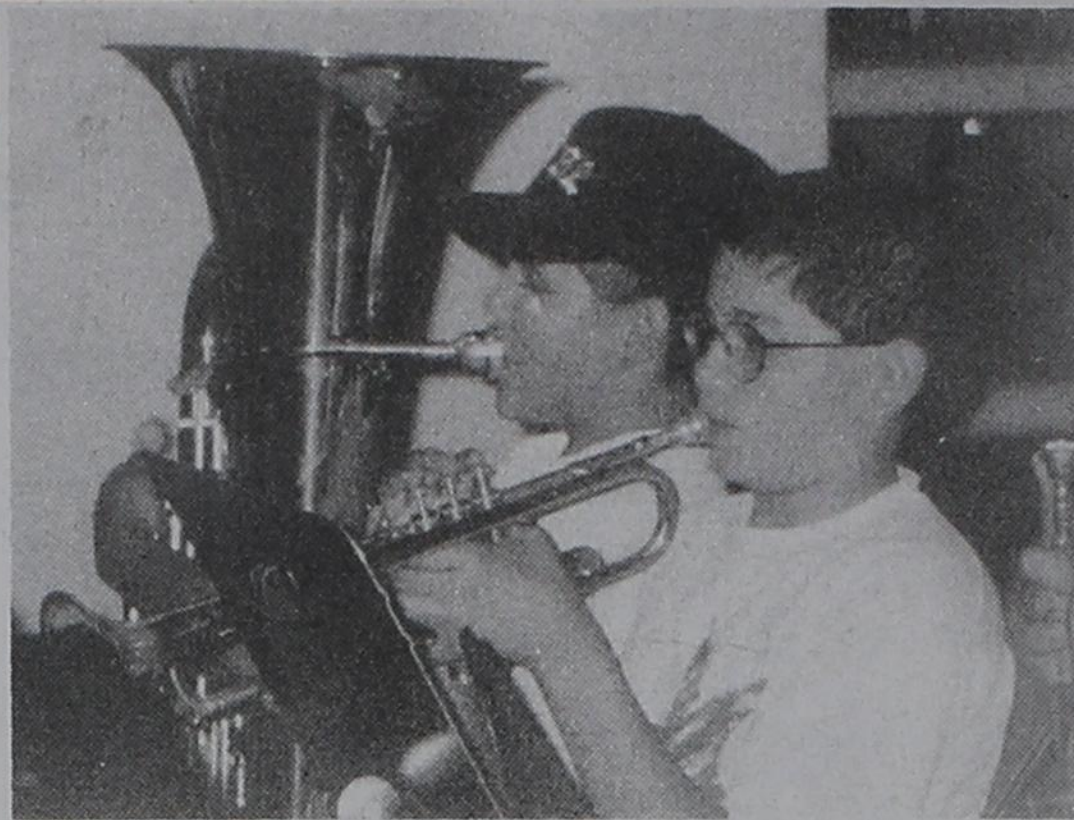
Don Hatley was named new Parmer County Deputy sheriff and moved here from Lubbock County.
