Attorney General Jim Matto announced today that between 1,500 and 2,000 letters are being mailed to consumers throughout Texas this week explaining a settlement agreement by which pecific life insurance policies they bought.

The settlement, which Mattox obtained in May, provides that consumers may seek refunds, plus

## Results Of TABS Tests Show Student Improvement

Results from tests given to Haskell students in grades three improvements in each class in math reading, and writing
The Texas Assessment of Basi Skills (TABS) tests are considered to be comprehensive tests and the an exit level test.
Haskell Superintendent Jame Lanier explained that the exit leve tests were considered the very minimums that a student should know prior to high schoo graduation. "These minimums are graduation requirements but are useful from a comparative standpoint since the tests change little from year to year", saic Lanier.
All ninth grade students were equired to take the tests as well students in grades higher than nin who had failed any part of the test. in the past.
A total of 45 HHS students took the ninth grade tests and 93 percent passed percent passed the math and writin percent pa
portions.
Both the percentages passing the
math and reading tests were higher than any past scores. In math the percentages passing since the 1979 -
80 school year were: $82 ; 75 ; 77 ; 81$. and 90 during the $1983-84$ school year.
In reading the scores since 197980 were: $74 ; 71 ; 74 ; 80$ and 93 for
the 1983-84 the $1983-84$.
Writing
Writing scores for the past five
years were: 68 for the years were: 68 for the 1979-80 year;
$86 ; 85 ; 100$ and 90 for $1983-84$ year The decrease in writing from last year is attributed to changes in the tests as well as changes in grading methods implemented when an
inordinate number of students inordinate number of student
across the state scored extremely high. In grade five a total of 47 students were tested and the largest improvement came in the reading tests where passing percentages increased from 72 percent in 1982-
83 to 84.5 percent in 1983-84. Math scores improved from 86 percent last year to 87.8 percent this year and writing grades remained almost constant from 87 percent last year to 86.5 percent this year.

students were tested and all three percentages increased from last
year. Math increased from 82 percent to 88.5 percent; reading from 87 to 88.1 percent and writing from 80 to 89.4 percent.
