CROP INSURANCE PROCEEDS
Many individuals will receive payments of crop insurance proceeds during 1984. The law generally provides that cash basis taxpayers must include these proceeds in

However, given a proper set of
circumstances, the circumstances, the reporting of these
proceeds for income tax purposes can be deferred to the next year. The law provides include crop insurance proceeds in gross income for the tax year following the year of damage or destruction provided he normally would have reported income from the crop in that following year.
For example, suppose you receive crop insurance payments during 1984 on a failed
cotton crop. If you can establish that cotton crop. If you can establish that

reported the income from that cotton crop in 1985, then you can elect to report the income 1985, then you can elect to repor
from the crop insurance in 1985 .

return affirmatively electing the special break. The statement should also list the crops damaged, the cause of the damage,
the name of the paying insurance company and the total amount of payments received. If you have received or will receive crop
insurance payments during 1984 , you should consult your tax advisor concerning the possibiility of deffering the reporting of those
