There is so much to worry about

A case in point: a recent nation news report centered on whether farm animals whose genetic make up is altered to make them bigger o grow faster suffer psychological cruelty.
Geneticists using advanced human growth hormone into animal embyros that will produce and elephant-sized cow that gives three times more milk than a typica maturity in only six months.
Genetic alteration has been going on since the dawn of history. We've always selectively crossed different breeds of cows, pigs or horses to obtain better livestock. But gene splices are like a breeder's drean come true-a chance to speed the
hybridization work leading to better animals that could take hundreds or thousands of years with present methods.
. fiddling couse there are dangers in fiddling with the natural order o
things. Thinking back to Frankenstein, it's terrifying to contemplate the unintentional melding of a body the size of a panel truck with the brain of any one of several criminally deviant cow pigs I have known personally.
However, I don't think However, commentator was concerned about the physical perils as the psychological effects of animal high-tech hybridization.
He argued that the unfortunate results of these experiments would be that lose an essential pareir species; their cowhood or pighood, if you will. In effect, by manipulating their genetic pattern and disrupting their sense of oneness with their genei

This stirs some interesting thougadjusted animals running los on our farms, Yorkshires crossed with Poland-Chinas or Herefords bred to Angus, that are balanced on the edge of psychic disintegration, ready to explode.

hybridization of animals may be way of protecting their fantasy of farm life from the realities of modern agriculture. After all, suppose it's just as hard to imagine Grandma
slopping a slopping a hog the size of a 47 owes halr, as it is to think that she the place. This. life would not be harmful if it rura city-dweller's private tragedy city-dweller's private tragedy to
mourn while sitting in the traffic mourn. Unfortunately it affect farmers. In many ways, it is the urbanite's belief that fresh air and nice sunrises are all that farmers need to live that disrupts our
message about the need for positive farm reform.
We know it's a far different world on the farm now, filled with much harsher realities than what our city brethren believe. There have to be technical changes to make us more productive an
keep us alive.
It's a new age. If the farm survive and the rest of the world to eat we're all going to have to adapt to the fact that things have changed down on the farm.

MORE THAN $50 \%$ REQUIRED An important provision in the 1984 Tax Reform Act concerns property used partly for business and partly for personal use. Such property must investment credit or accelerated depreciation deductions will be allowed.
Therefore, computers, boats, airplanes automobiles, trucks, and other property used partly for business and partly for personal entertainment or recreation will be subject to this test.
You may be wondering how the IRS will know if you use a boat or computer $40 \%$ or $75 \%$ for business. The burden of proof, beginning in 1985, will be on the taxpayer. You are required to keep adequate "contemporaneous
substantiate your business usage
substantiate your business usage.
If a taxpayer doesn't have adequate contemporaneous records-that is, records kept currently during the year as the business usage for the item. If a taxpayer claims crodits deductions without adequate records to support them, he will be subject to negligence penalties. The contemporaneous records must state business use of the property as well as the business purpose.
Where business usage of equipment is more than $50 \%$ in the first year but decreases in later years, recapture of investment credit and deductions is required.
Tax return preparers will be required to advise taxpayers of the rules and get from their clients written certiincation that he taxpayer has ke adequate records. If you haven't already done so, you will want to check with your accountant for assistance in making this recordkeeping requlvins with the so as to lose deductions.
