As a young man growing up in Haskell, it was evident to those who were close to Crockett, that he wa Haskell native, he promoted free enterprise through his work with he family owned dairy. Crockett, Covell Adkins, Jack and John Kimbrough, delivered milk from
the Engligh family dairy to families in Haskell. For recreation, the skated, ice--in winter--, in English Park, and played basketball at other inmes of the year at the first known indoor basketball court in Haske County.
During the school year, the emphasis was on football and the team, which listed those dedicated
Haskell Indians, is a legend to those who can remember "the good old days'".
