Indians win Roscoe tournament

The Haskell Indians won their second tournament of the year in Roscoe Saturday as they knocked off district rival Hawley, 64-57, to claim the boys' championship.

They had advanced to the finals with a 74-52 win over Colorado City Thursday and a 65-55 victory over Roby in Friday's semifinals.

Three Indians scored in the double figures in the finals Saturday night as the Indians upped their record to 11-3. Brad Bevel had 22 points, Dusty Meeks added 18 and James Rike pitched in 15 as the Indians took command early and moved out to a 42-32 halftime lead.

In the semifinals, Mark Young paced the scoring with 18 points, followed by Chan Guess with 12 and Meeks with 11. Haskell virtually put the game away in the first quarter, moving out to a 25-14 lead.

The opening win over Colorado City Thursday was a little different, as the Indians trailed 20-19 at the end of the first quarter, and 38-36 at halftime. But they outscored the Class 3-A Wolves 16-6 in the third period and 21-10 in the final frame to win easily. Meeks scored 21 points in that game, while Young had 13. Derrick Billington had 11 and Bevel

Maidens lose in Saturday finals

The Haskell Maidens' bid to win their third tournament championship this month fell one game short Saturday night when the locals went down in overtime, 47-43, to Roscoe in the finals of the Roscoe tournament.

They had reached the finals with a 63-55 victory over Roby Friday after opening the tournament with a 60-33 win over Colorado City Thursday.

Trailing 18-14 at halftime in the championship game, the Maidens fought back to lead 30-28 at the threequarter mark. Roscoe outscored Haskell 15-13 in the final quarter to send the game into overtime and then scored 4 points in the extra period while the Maidens were held

Dala Harris with 12 points and Robyn Weaver with 10 were top scorers in the championship game.

In the semifinals, the Maidens led all the way to take the victory over roby. Missy Davis put in 15 points to top the scorers. Weaver had 14 and Tiffany Moeller scored 12.

Thursday's opening-round win over Colorado City was no contest. The Maidens led 47-16 at the end of three periods. Joy McKeever was top scorer with 15 points.

Last week's tournament games gave the Maidens a record of 12-2 for the season. They suffered their first loss of the year last Tuesday at Seymour, falling 57-54.

R.C. Couch Jr.

R. C. Couch Jr., Haskell banker and longtime civic leader, died late Tuesday night (Dec. 15) at his home in Haskell. He was 68.

He was chairman of the board of Haskell National Bank.

Funeral services were at 2 p.m. Sunday in the First Baptist Church with the Rev. Densman officiating. Burial was in Willow Cemetery, under direction of Holden-McCauley Funeral Home.

Pallbearers were Buck Everett, W. R. Hager, Bill Wilson, Tom Watson, Royce Williams, Royce Adkins, Dan R. Griffith and Abe Turner.

Honorary pallbearers were Raja Hassen, Rick Perry, Rob Howard, Andy Gannaway, Larry McMillian, Mattie Felker English, Bobbye Corzine, Bob Herren, Pat Hale, Adell Thomas, Elbert Johnson and J. B. Gibson.

Couch and his wife were named earlier this year by the Haskell Chamber of Commerce as the Outstanding Citizens of the Year.

A Haskell native, he was born Jan. 3, 1919, and graduated from Haskell High School in 1936. He graduated from Texas A&M University in 1941 with a bachelor of science degree in agriculture. He was married to Jerrene Verner Sept. 4, 1943, in Rule.

He served as an officer in the 90th division during World War II and was commander of an infantry company during the D-Day invasion. He remained on active duty until 1947, and then served in the army reserve until he retired as a colonel in 1969.

He was a farmer and rancher from 1948 to 1978 and was with the United States Department of agriculture from 1936 to 1971 when he retired from civil service.

He became a stockholder and director in Haskell National Bank in 1967, and in 1972 he purchased 27 percent of the stock in the institution. He became trust officer/farm and ranch management in 1972 and was vice chairman of the board until January 1985. He became chairman of the board in 1985.

Couch was president/director of the North Central Municipal Water Authority for 22 years, a member of the Executive Council of the West Texas Council of Government the past 10 years and president of the Haskell Memorial Civic Center for the past 14 years.

He was active in numerous civic organizations, including the Rotary Club and the Haskell Industrial Foundation. He was a member of the First Baptist Church.

He is survived by his wife; a daughter, Jerre Moore of Misawa, Japan; a son, Riley C. Couch III of Dallas; two sisters, Sue Baxter and Mary Ogilvie, both of Dallas; his step-mother, Hassie Couch of Haskell; and two grandchildren, Michelle Moore and Shannon Moore of Misawa, Japan.

Gore endorsement surprises Demos

AUSTIN-Some Texans were happy, some were angry, but just about all Democrats were surprised last week when their state party chairman took sides in the presidential sweepstakes.

Democratic Party chief Bob Slagle announced his personal endorsement of Tennessee U. S. Sen. Albert Gore at a Capitol press conference with Gore.

His move delighted Gore's Texas supporters, who hope it



will propel him past secondplace holder Massachusetts Gov. Michael Dukakis to catch the leader, the Rev. Jesse Jackson.

But Slagle's move also angered the many other Democrats who support one of the six other candidates, particularly those who think Slagle as chairman should stay neutral.

His endorsement, along with that of former Gov. Mark White's campaign manager, Dwayne Holman, came the same day all candidates except late entry Gary Hart were holding an unprecedented debate in Edinburg.

Timing Embarrassing

The timing of Slagle's endorsement was embarrassing to the other candidates, and indicated they didn't mean anything to the party's state chairman.

But Slagle has never really been one to stay neutral during his eight-year tenure, the longest anyone has ever held what used to be a temporary plum.

On several previous occasions, he has jumped into state and federal races with an endorsement well before the primary. In this case, he hasn't even waited until the filing deadline.

Slagle justified his act by explaining that Democrats are begging him to prevent another "Mondale-Ferraro" catastrophe.

Certainly that's true, but as the non-Gore Texas Democrats fume about his course of action, many are vowing it's time for him to go and take his protege, Holman,

Hart Lacks Support

Slagle wasn't at the bottom of the dog list last week, however.

Gary Hart, who had the strongest organization in Texas until his monkey business prompted him to drop out of the race, drew almost no voices of support from his former Texas team.

His re-entry was blasted, particularly by former U.S. Sen. Ralph Yarborough who said Hart disgraced himself, the party and the

And the premier warhorse of Hart's former Texas team, Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby, said Hart's reentry lacked "political realism."

Mattox vs. PUC

The legal skirmishing between Attorney Gen. Jim Mattox and the Public Utility Commission escalated to the Texas Supreme Court last week.

Lawyers for the PUC told the high court that Mattox should be barred from fighting rate increase requests by utilities because he already has a constitutional duty to represent the PUC and other state

A Houston Lighting and Power Co. attorney also argued Mattox has a conflict of interest and cannot fairly and legally fight for more than one side in a utility rate

Within Mattox's agency is one division which represents ratepayers opposed to PUC-ordered rate hikes, and another division which defends the PUC orders in the courtroom.

Mattox's counsel argues that if his office is prevented from representing ratepayers, he cannot protect the state agencies which also pay \$250 million for electricity.

But a new twist was thrown in when another assistant attorney general, Steve Baron, told the justices that Mattox's duty is to defend the PUC in court, even against the interests of other state agencies. "He cannot abandon the PUC, as he's attempting to do in this case," Baron said.



Dan Morales, D-San Antonio, the House sponsor of this year's \$5.7 billion tax package predicted Thursday. He said lawmakers would have to turn to an income tax or an expanded sales tax to pay the growing bill.

And he brings new ideas, like the idea of kissing babies if they're wearing lipstick, tight jeans and spiked heels.

If you buy a marriage license after Jan. 1, you're going to have to wait three days before you can get married.

County Clerk Woody Frazier says a new law, effective Jan. 1, requires a 72-hour waiting period between issuance of the license and the wedding ceremony.

Beginning with the effective date, Frazier said his office will be required to put the time of day on each license issued. Clergymen and others authorized to conduct weddings will be expected to check each marriage license to be certain the 72-hour waiting period has elapsed.

Under the law, weddings performed before the 72-hour wait will be voidable and subject to annulment.

There are two exceptions to the 72-hour waiting period: a member of the U.S. armed forces on active duty, and an applicant with a district court order permitting an earlier wedding.

Have you been tempted to order some of those \$6.89-per-carton mail order cigarettes which have been advertised lately in some newspapers?

That's what State Comptroller Bob Bullock advises. He says it's better to believe in Santa Claus than out-of state schemes for discount cigarettes.

"Your chances are infinitely better that ol' St. Nick will stuff your Christmas stocking with smokes before these so-called bargain cigarettes will get stuffed into your mailbox," says Bullock.

He said state tax auditors are looking into offers of "wholesale prices" on cigarettes from out-of-state firms which are not paying the \$2.60per-carton Texas tax.

Some respondents to the ads are finding out they are required to purchase a "discount coupon book" that costs nearly \$40 before they can qualify for the advertised price.

Writing of the avalanche of advertising these days, columnist George Will says that the typical American is exposed to 3,000 commercial messages a day.

He estimates that the average American will spend a year and a half of his life just watching television commercials.

But it's not just television, newspapers, etc., he's talking about. Advertising messages appear on parking meters, ski-lift towers, bus shelters, supermarket shopping carts, on closed-circuit television in supermarkets, on giant screens at baseball parks, on mobile billboards towed by trucks through city streets, as lead-in segments on movies rented for home use; on restaurant menus, on the stall doors in restaurant restrooms, in dentists' offices, in hospitals in doctors' lounges and even doctor's scrub rooms.

He points out that scrub-room advertisements are for financial services, and then adds: "One does hope that, while scrubbing, the surgeons are thinking of things other than their stock portfolios.

Harvest about over

U.S. Dept. of Agriculture Dec. 18, 1987

The long spell of pleasant weather finally gave way to rain and snow in this area Sunday night and Monday (Dec. 13-14). The few farmers who have not finished harvesting saw further delays due to the cold, damp weather.

A small number of gins throughout the area have now completed ginning for the season, while several others are nearing completion.

Receipts are remaining high at the classing office despite these factors. Through Dec. 27, 476,391 samples had been classed in Abilene. The Abilene office classed 98,211 samples this week alone, as the three shifts continue to increase output. There is now a 60,000 sample carryover which is about a five-day backlog. This is down from a seven-day backlog a week ago.

Grades gain ran lower this week as 32 was called most frequently. Less than 24 pcernt was called 21 or 31, down from 33 percent one week ago. Micronaire readings continued falling to more than two points below the season average. Length was the only reading that made a gain this past

The market was somewhat more active this week, due in part to higher cotton futures as well as Christmas incluences on selling. Higher grades were bringing seven to eight cents a pound over the loan while lower grades were bringing around 11 cents a pound over the loan.

Grade 42, 33 staple, premium mike, was reported around 58 cents a pound. In some instances, cotton with strength of 2.6 or more and with premium mike was bringing as much as two cents premium per pound.



TAKE YOUR DEDUCTIONS IN 1987

Tax deductions for 1987 are worth more than the same deductions will be worth in 1988. Tax rates are higher this year. The top rate is 38.5% for 1987. Next year it will drop to 28% (33% for some high income taxpayers). You will save taxes by taking as many deductions as possible in 1987.

MEDICAL EXPENSES: On your 1987 return they are deductible only to the extent they exceed 7.5% of your Adjusted Gross Income. If you are going to reach the 7.5% limit, maximize your deductions by paying all outstanding medical and dental bills before December 31. Have elective surgery done or get medical checkups for yourself and your whole family. If you are not going to reach the 7.5% limit, defer payment of medical expenses until next year when you may reach the limit.

TAXES: Pay your local, school, and country property taxes before December 31 so you may take the deduction on your 1987 return.

CONTRIBUTIONS: Make charitable contributions to churches and charities now instead of waiting until next year. Pay next year's commitments with a contribution this year.

BUSINESS EXPENSES: Buy new equipment and place it in service before year-end. You can deduct up to \$10,000 of the cost immediately and depreciate the balance. Have repairs and maintenance completed before the end of the year. Purchase needed supplies, prepay insurance costs, pay promotion and advertising expenses, and give employees their bonuses by December 31.

Some individuals could be affected by the Alternative Minimum Tax and should defer expenses and increase 1987 income. Consult your tax advisor to determine if you are subject to the Alternative Minimum Tax.
