equinox, so as to cut down on
some of the confusion some of the confusion.
The earliest that Easter can occur is March 22, not too
far removed from this year's date. The source that we used did not name the latest possible date, although we know that the most common date is April 19--so it has to
be several days beyond this date.
Early in this century, dele-
gations of church gations of church officials suggested that the movable
date of Easter and its assocdate of Easter and its assoc-
iated observances be replaced
by a fixed date, like that of Christmas. The Church of the Vatican had no objections to the proposed reform, but to date no change has been implemented.
