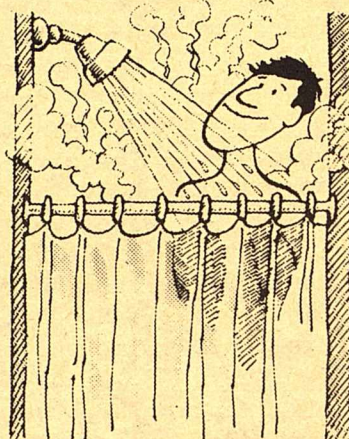

When planting dig a large enough pit, stake the tree and then water thoroughly.

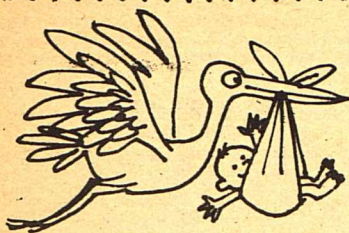

Coke Ranchers Improving Forage

Many Coke County ranchers are making excellent progress in improving their forage resource. Thousands of brush infested acres have been

rootplowed and seeded to range grasses. Many concrete water storage facilities and ponds were also constructed. This helps to improve the grazing distribution of livestock and helps in the overall management of the grassland resource.

Those are just a few of the practices ranchers received cost-share assistance on through the ACP and Great Plains Conservation Program. These programs are administered by the Agriculture Stabilization and Conservation Service and the Soil Conservation Service offices. Other practices eligible for cost-share by these programs are cross-fencing, water pipelines, water wells, diversions and terraces.

The Great Plains Conservation Program is

best suited to apply a complete conservation program on an entire unit. When approved, funds are set aside for the application of the complete conservation plan. The landuser can plan for a program several years ahead.

The ACP program is better suited for the application of a single practice or the treatment of a part of a land unit. For information, contact the Soil Conservation Service, P.O. Box 85, Robert Lee, Texas, Phone 453-2623.

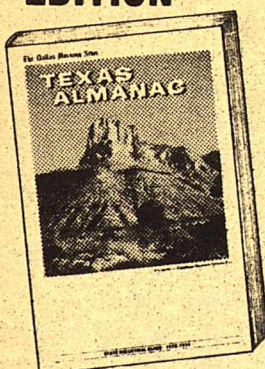

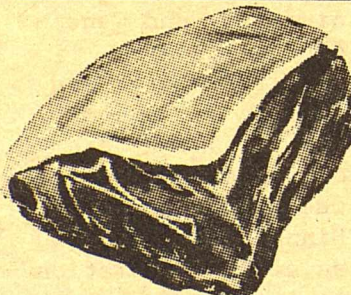

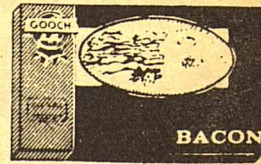
