Attorney General Rules County Ambulance Okay

An official opinion from the office of Attorney General John Hill to County Attorney Robert E. Owen indicates that Coke County may provide ambulance service for its residents.

Owen ruled several months ago that the county could not provide ambulance service, basing his opionion on the wording of the statutes which created the West and East Coke County Hospital Districts.

However, this ruling from Attorney General Hill reverses Owen's opinion and lays open a legal route for the commissioners court of Coke County to act on the matter.

Since ambulance service is of great interest and importance to Coke County citizens, the opinion of the

attorney general is being printed below: Opinion No. H-1279 Re: Whether a county located in a hospital district may provide ambulance service. Dear Mr. Owen:

You ask whether Coke County may provide ambulance service for its citizens. Part of Coke County is included in the West Coke County Hospital District, Acts 1963, 58th Leg., ch. 315, at 825, while the rest of the county is included in the East Coke County Hospital District, Acts 1969, 61st Leg., ch. 444, at 1485. Both hospital districts were created pursuant to article IX. section 9, of the Texas Constitution, which provides in part:

(A)ny district so created shall assume full responsibility for providing medical and hospital care for its needy inhabitants..... (A) fter its creation no other municipality or political subdivision shall have the power to levy taxes or issue bonds or other obligations for hospital purposes or for providing medical care within the boundaries of the district....

Similar language appears in the enabling statutes of each hospital district. See Acts 1969, 61st Leg., Ch. 444, S3, at 1485; Acts 1963, 58th Leg., ch. 315, SS2, 19, at 825. You suggest that ambulance service constitutes "medical care" within the Constitution and enabling acts, so that the county may not levy taxes or issue obligations of indebtedness in order to provide it. See Attorney General Opinions H-454, H-367 (1974).

We believe your question has been answered by Attorney General Opinion M-385 (1969). That opinion concluded that the Terry County Hospital District, created under the authority of article IX, section 9, could operate an ambulance service in cooperation with Terry County and a city Continued on Page 13

County Farms Losing Tons of Soil

Estimating soil loss from cropland is just part of the job of the Soil Conservation Service, according to Eph Cummins, SCS District Conservationist serving the Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District.

The real task is helping farmers with conservation management and erosion control practices that will bring the soil loss down to limits where the soil will remain productive for years to come.

"Many fields in Coke
County are still losing
too much soil to maintain a constant level
of productivity over
a long period of time,"
says Cummins. Many
farms are actually losing 10 or more tons of
soil every year, which
is excessive.

"If these erosion rates continue, nothing will be left eventua-

11y but the subsoil and this land usually has to be converted to pasture or trees.

Even then it's not very productive," Cummins said.

The Coke County Soil and Water Conservation District is making an effort to get farmers to request assistance in estimating the soil loss on their cropland. In most cases, conservation practices can be applied to reduce these losses to a point where the land remains productive and farmers still make a profit.

In the long run, conservation pays. Bringing soil losses down on cropland in Coke County will not only benefit the farmer but will benefit everyone who depends on farm crops. That includes nearly every individual. '64 CLUB CHRISTMAS PARTY IN IVEY HOME







Mr. Richard M. Casillas urges all aliens to report before the end of January, as willful failure to do so may lead to serious pena-





The van will be operated between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays through Fridays.

In order to obtain transportation service, senior citizens should reserve a seat at least 24 hours in advance. Because of limited seating capacity, reservations will be made on a first-come, first-served basis.

Notes from the Extension Office

Best buys at Texas grocery markets this week include several fresh-produce items and fryer chickens.

This week's pricequality trends are the following:

POULTRY--Whole and cut-up fryers offer bargains along with chicken liver.

FRESH VEGETABLES--Best buys include dry yellow onions, potatoes, carrots, squash, sweet potatoes and rutabagas.

Also, cabbage and bulk turnips have attractive price tags.

FRESH FRUITS--More grapefruit and oranges appear at most markets, but prices are moderately higher. Other economical choices are

apples, bananas, tangerines and tangelos. FISH--Serve proteinrich fish for econom-

ical and quick meals. DAIRY--Features include cheeses, low-fat milk, sour cream, halfand-half, yogurt and whipping cream.

GROCERY MARKET AISLES--"Specials" are cooking oil, cake mixes, flour, canned tuna fish and various canned fru-

its and vegetables. BEEF--Prices are relatively high. Specials include some tender cuts, along with beef chuck steaks and roasts, ribs and round steaks, ground beef and liver. Also look for boneless roast specials. Study newspaper ads and instore information for best buys.



within the district. It found provision of an ambulance service to be an auxiliary function of a hospital district and determined that a district could undertake it, but did not have the exclusive duty to do so. See Attorney General Opinion C-759 (1966). The operation of an ambulance service by the hospital district did not preclude a similar undertaking by another political subdivision within the district or the cooperative effort

inquired about.

We believe Attorney General Opinion M-385 reached the correct result. See Attorney General Opinion H-976 (1977). More recent authorities support its conclusion by characterizing the provision of ambulance service as not solely a hospital or medical function. In Ayala v. City of Corpus Christi, 507 S.W. 2d 324 (Tex. Civ. App. - Corpus Christi 1974, no writ) the court described ambulance service as "kindred to the police or fire service." It stated that this "service is incident to the police power of the state i.e. to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of its citizens." We relied on the views of the Ayala court in Attorney General Opinion H-562 (1975), which determined that rural fire prevention districts, established pursuant to article 3, section 48d of the Constitution, could be given statutory authority to provide emergency ambulance service. See also Attorney General Opinion M-231 (1968) (operation of emergency ambulance service by firemen).

Consequently, we do not believe that the establishment of hospital districts in Coke County divests the county of its authority to provide ambulance service within the district. See V.T.-C.S. art. 4418f; Attorney General Opinions H-976 (1977); M-806 (1971); M-385 (1969); C-772, C-772, C-759 (1966).

SUMMARY

A county, wholly included within hospital districts established pursuant to article IX, section 9 of the Texas Constitution, may provide ambulance service.






