

Twenty-seven of them were killed almost instantly by the explosion o gas in the balloon or burned to death as the flaming wreck fell to the ground from a height of 900 feet and enveloped them. One man, Lieutenant Baron von Bieul of the Queen Au gusta Grenadier Guards, à guest of the admiralty board, was extricated alive from the mass of twisted wreck age. His eyes were burned out and he suffered other injuries. Begging his rescuers to kill him and end his sufferings he was taken to a hospital where he died later.

HUERTA SAYS HE WILL NOT RESIGN

General Asserts He Is in Office to Re-Establish Peace Within Law if Possible, but to Make Peace.

City of Mexico .- Provisional President Huerta has not resigned nor has he fled from the capital. When seen at the national palace Sunday he said he had no intention of doing either.

"When I resign," said General Huerta, "It will be to seek a resting place six feet in the soil. When I flee the capital it will be to shoulder a rifle and take my place in the ranks to fight the rebels."

This was President Huerta's answer to questions as to whether there was any foundation for reports which have been freely circulated in the capital and have found their way to the United States. General Huerta looked the picture of health and energy.

"So it is reported that I have fled." the president said. "You can see for yourself that I am here at my post. To say that I have resigned or intend to resign is an absolute falsehood. I have no intention of resigning.

"Should the elections, which will be held as I have promised, indicate another for the presidency, I shall step aside. Until that time you will find me here complying with my promises to the nation, which are to re-establish peace, within the law if possible, but to re-establish peace."

"Another thing," said the president, 'I have money for my requirements. Don't you think I haven't. Where did I get it? My secret," he responded, "but I have it."

MANY SOLDIERS KILLED IN WRECK

Train Plunges Through Trestle Near State Line in Mississippi-One Hundred Injured.

Meridian, Miss .- Twenty federal soldiers were killed and about one hundred hurt when a special troop train on the Mobile and Ohlo railroad plunged through a trestle near State Line, Miss., late Sunday afternoon.

The wreck was caused by the engine tender jumping the track about two hundred feet from a trestie. The engine was not derailed and passed over the trestle safely. The tender broke loose from the engine, however, and plunged with the baggage car and three conches to the ground twentyfive feet below

Los Angeles .- Ever since Lonesome Jack Allman was seven years old he has been "foolin' 'round" snakes. He has captured his 18,040th snake. "The rattlesnake is the most intelli-

gent of all reptiles and the most aftectionate." Jack declared. "After they have been fanged they are the most desirable of snake pets. They can be made to come to you just like a pet dog or cat." Jack and bis brother Sherley made a journey through the mountains the past week in quest of snakes and brought back several large rattlers.

"I found out that rattlers were thicker in the mountains this summer than they have been for years," he said. "The season seems to have been just right to bring them out. A forest ranger told me that he had killed more this summer than in the last five years put together.

"I have been bitten by rattlers seven times in my life, but always had permanganate of potash with me and saved myself from serious harm. I promptly split the wound with my knife and apply the antidote before the polson has had time to get into my system."




