Commissioners and Williamson

At a special session of the Commissioners court on the 19th inst. the controversy between county treasurer A. B. Williamson and the old court was adjusted to the satisfaction of all parties. Canal Zone Dry

Col. George W. Goethals, governor of the Pan ama Canal Zone, has signed an order placing all persons engaged in canal transportation on strictly temperance basis. The order provides that all persons employed on the canal who have marine licenses must abstain absolutely from liquor. This includes pilots taking ships through the caual, captains of tugboats and others.

The Panama Canal Zone already is under the prohibition of the manufacture and sale of intoxicants. The order signed today extends the prohibition to those employed in the Zone, and, no matter if they get liquor outside the Zone, they dare not use it. The idea of the government is to make prohibition prohibit in the Canal Zone.
