



#### Beer and the Fair

The question of the legality of running a beer saloon under the grand stand at the Fair grounds came up Monday before County Judge Lee Wallace. M. F. Weston had procured license but wished to transfer it, and Fred. F. Real filed application to operate the saloon. Judge J. R. Burnett, who is a stockholder of the Fair, on behalf of himself and other citizens filed opposition on the ground that the Fair grounds, just outside the city limits, was not a proper place for selling beer where there were assembled several thousand people, more than half being women and children, and that under the law the application must show that "no other person or corporation shall in any manner be interested" in the business, when in fact the Fair always received the profits. Mr. Real is not a saloon man but is a director of the Fair. He stated that there was no agreement that he was to give the profits to the Fair, but admitted that this had been done in the past and that J. M. Hamilton, former secretary of the Fair, was looking after obtaining the license. Mr. Hamilton said there was no agreement between Mr. Real and the Fair that he should donate the profits to the Fair, but that the Fair had always rereceived the profits.

Heretofore one of the saloon men would take out the license, but it seems they tired of assuming so great a responsibility solely for the honor or pleasure, if any, of the title, for the Fair always got the profits and of course helped run the institution. Judge Burnett contended that the Fair was not only interested in the business, but that it was evident that Mr. Real was not to run the saloon for his own benefit, and that a general understanding and practice was equivalent to a positive agreement. Judge Wallace decided, however, to grant the license but said he would submit the matter to Comptroller Terrell who has authority to revoke the license.

The Advance editor is not a lawyer, but it looks to him that a party who gets all the profits is considerably interested in the business, if not the whole thing itself. A few years ago the law cut out racetrack gambling and it now seems it has cut out the saloon, its twin vice. It is an unjust reflection on the Chirstian and moral ideals of our people to insist that a beer saloon is necessary to the success of so useful and beneficial an institution as our county Fair. It is stated the profits from the saloon nets the fair association about \$200 each year. A good citizen has suggested that a subscription list be circulated and the \$200 raised and donated to the Fair each year to offset the necessity of running a saloon to help finance it.

The man who gets mad at what the newspaper says about him should return thanks three times a day for what the paper failed to say about him that ought to be said.

#### Community Co-Operation.

A merchant in one of our smaller towns made the statement to me not long ago that the reason he refused to carry standard brands of clothing and shoes was that this class of goods costs both the retailer and the customer more than the unadvertised sort-because of the money spent by manufacturers in advertising.

To prove this contention he exhibited a suit, of the non-standard variety, containing his private brand, with this argument:

"This suit was made by one of the best known manufacturers of standard clothes in this country. It retails under the established trademark for \$25.00 the same price I ask for it. I buy these clothes, without the makers' name in them, for \$15.00 per suit, whereas if I demanded the makers' name I must pay \$18.50. In other words I must either lose \$3.50 profit on each sale, which amount goes into a fund to pay for the makers' advertising, or else raise the price to the consumer."

Investigation on my part developed the fact that the manufacturers in question refuse to place their name and trademark on a suit until it has been carefully inspected and found to come up to standard in every way. Suits containing faulty material or workmanship are called "seconds" and sold unbranded at reduced prices. The makers have invested too much money in the good will of their name to permit its association with faulty or under-standard

This incident is illustrative of existing manufacturing and merchandising methods, and conditions, that are of vital importance to you and every other

There are two distinct classes of merchandise on the market: Standard goods of known quality, backed by reputable makers, and goods of unknown or doubtful quality and origin. It should not be a difficult matter to judge which class offers you greatest advantage. - Farm and Ranch.



## Masons and Saloons.

A few weeks ago we published a elipping from the Baptist Advance to the effect that Masons in Arkansas were forbidden to have any part in the circulation of petitions for saloons. A letter has come from one of the leading Masons of that State onfirming this significant fact. He writes: "A year ago the grand lodge of Arkansas adopted the law, called by the Masons an edict, forbidding any of the members of the fraternity signing a petition for a saloon or circulating such petition. It was considered quite a radical step and many of its enemies protested that the succeeding grand lodge would repeal it, but instead of doing so, it has re-affirmed and made 't stronger. The first allowed a lodge to inflict any penalty, even a moderate reprimand for a member signing the petition. Some of the lodges in the State simply reprimanded those of their smembers who signed. The last grand lodge, however, so changed the edict as to provide that the penalty must be expulsion from the order or definite suspension, which s almost as severe as expulsion."
