



### **Red Cross Column**

Americans captured and held in German prison camps are to be looked after by the American Red Cross. Already a prisoner relief committee has been organized, under supervision of Ellis L: Dresel of the American legion at Berne, Switzerland. The German policy of giving prisoners poor and scanty rations is to be counteracted by shipping food parcels to American prisoners. Each will contain a postcard, to be signed as a reciept and returned, as a means of making sure the Americans get the aid intended for them.

These packages will contain ten pounds of meat, a quantity of butter food. The parcels will be sent three times in a fortnigt. Arrangements also have been made permitting sending clothing, money and letters.




