## How to Secure a Liberty Bond

You are satisfied that it is your duty to yourself and your Country to buy a Liberty Bond. Now you want to know just how to secure one.

Go to any Bank, sign the application form for the bond of the value desired. The bonds are of the following values: \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1000, \$5000, and \$10,000.

Your Banker will take your check for 2 per cent of the amount of the bond you decide to purchase. The remaining payments will be made as follows:

18 per cent on November 15th, 1917.

40 per cent on December 15th, 1917.

40 per cent on January 15th, 1918.

You can pay in full at time of application for any bonds up to the value of \$1000, if you wish.

If you care to pay for your bond in full at time of application you can have your bond by about October 10th. If you pay by instalments you will receive your bond as soon as you have finished paying for it.

The bonds are free from State, or Local taxes. In case of wealthy people who pay income surtaxes, and hold bonds of over \$5000, there is a small tax, but so far the average man is concerned they are tax free.

Any Banker will handle your application and charge you nothing for the service.

The interest on the bonds is 4 per cent payable to you on May 15th and November 15th each year.

The Bonds may be redeemed in full by the Government any time after November 15th, 1927. In the meantime the bonds may pass from one person to another in almost the same manner as a dollar bill does.

There is very little difference between giving your check for a \$500 bill and giving it for a Liberty Bond.

## Boys Corn Club.


The Kerr County Boys Corn Club under the superintendency of County Farm Demonstrator K. G. Baker is doing some good work notwithstanding the drought.

"There are 7,000 men in training at the Fort Riley camp in Kansas," says "Capper's Weekly." "There will soon be 48,000. So far there has not been one case of drunkenness since the camp was opened more than a month ago. No other army camp in the United States has

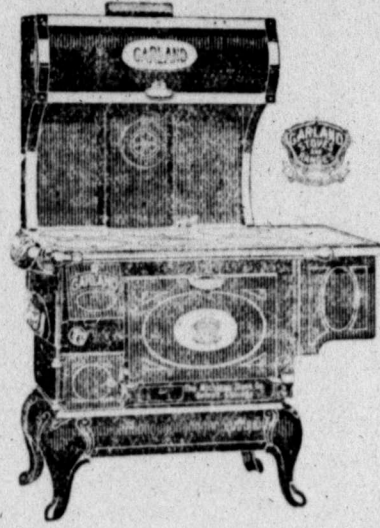
such a record, because it isn't possible to do this without a 'bone-dry' law. Fort Riley is well within the borders of Kansas and booze sellers cannot get at the men.

"By order of the War Department selling liquor to a soldier is punishable by a fine of \$1,000 or a year in prison. Yet, severe as this penalty is, it does not prevent saloonists from selling liquor to soldiers in other parts of the country."

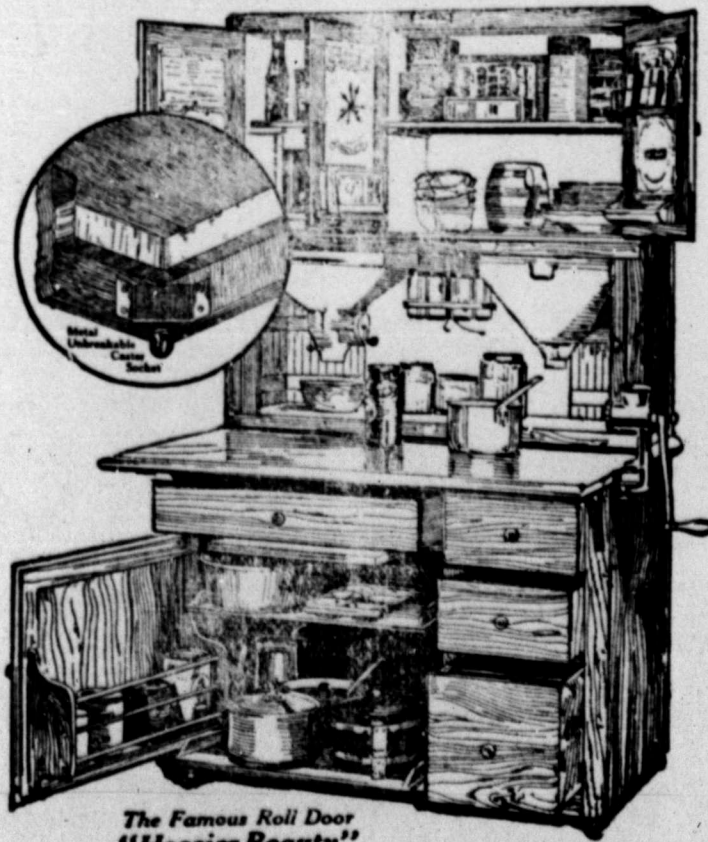

Notice is hereby given to whom concerned, that R. F. Hunt, whose postoffice address is Kerrville, Texas, did on the 1st day of October, A. D., 1917, file an application in the office of the Board of Water Engineers of the State of Texas, in which he applies for a permit to appropriate 1 1/2 cubic feet of water per second of time for the purpose of irrigating certain lands hereinafter described, from the unappropriated waters of the State of Texas, to be diverted from the Guadalupe river, by means of a pumping plant, located on the Samuel Wallace Survey No. 112, and on the north bank of the Guadalupe river, two miles in a southeasterly direction from the town of Kerrville, in Kerr County, Texas.

You are hereby further noticed that the lands proposed to be irrigated consist of a part of the said Samuel Wallace Survey No. 112, described by metes and bounds in the application aggregating 26 acres, and situated in Kerr County, Texas.

A hearing on the said application of the said R. F. Hunt will be held by the Board of Water Engineers of the State of Texas, at its office, in the City of Austin, County of Travis, said State, on Monday, the 29th day of October, A. D. 1917, beginning at ten o'clock A. M., at which time and place all parties interested may appear and be heard. Such hearing will be continued from time to time and from place to place, if necessary, until such determination has been made relative to said application as the said Board of Water Engineers may deem right, equitable and proper.
