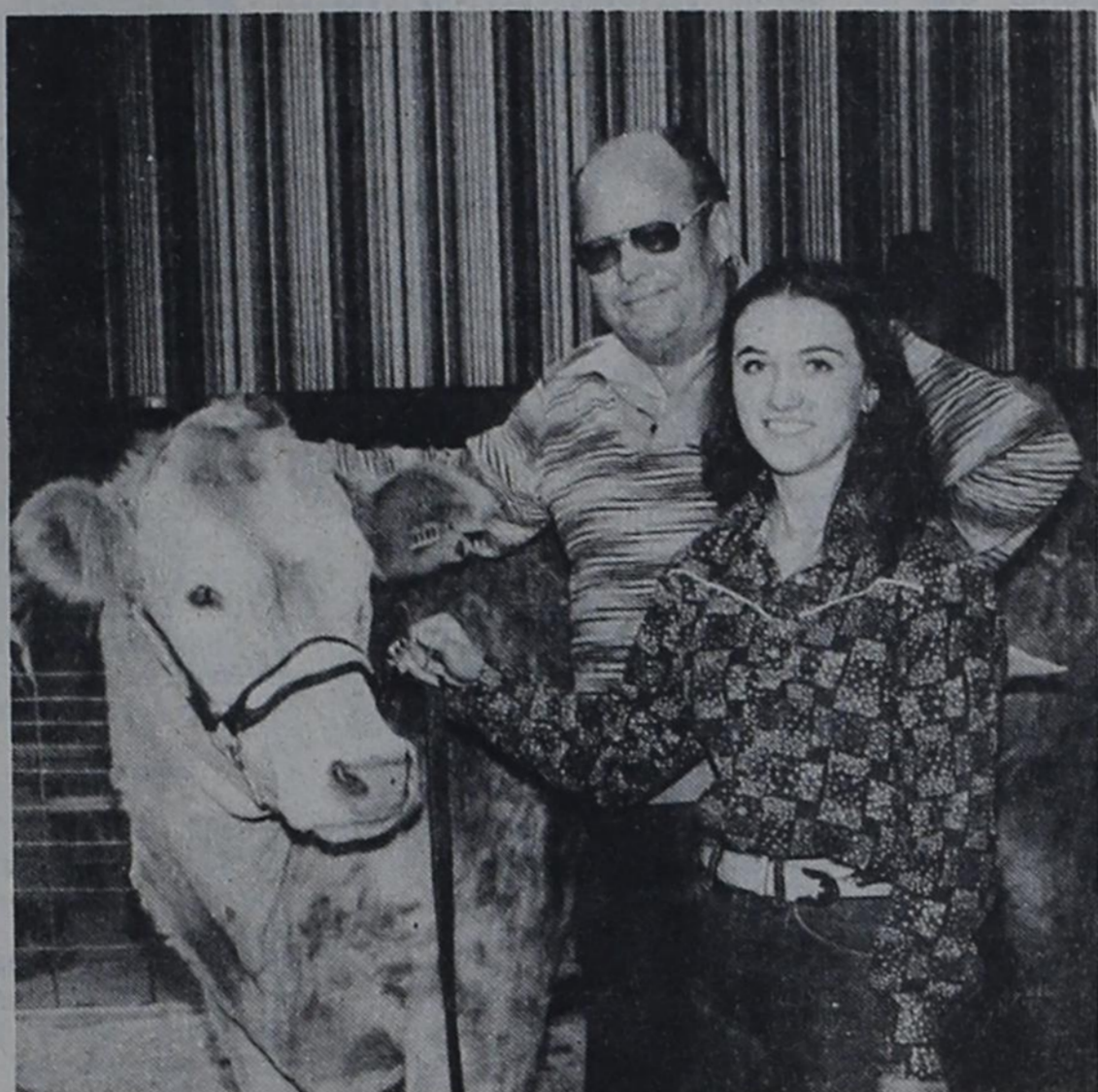

## WINS TWO TITLES

# Bovina Dominates County Stock Show

Bovina's young showmen were much in evidence at the 31st annual Parmer County Junior Livestock Show Friday at Friona.

The local youths dominated the champion trophies, winning two of the three grand champion honors presented.

Joan Carson, for the second time in three years, exhibited the grand champion steer in the show, and young Tim Garner had the grand champion sheep.

Miss Carson won the title with an 1191-pound Charolais Cross animal that she had taken first place with in the steer show's "jumbo" division. She had won the steer title in 1976 with another Charolais entry.

Garner won the lamb show's grand champion trophy with some nifty showing, winning honors with his medium wool entry which he had guided to breed champion honors in the giant six-division setup for the medium wool division.

Miss Carson's grand champion steer was bought at Saturday's auction sale by Big Country Ford of Clovis, N.M., on a bid of \$1.10 per pound. Agri-Sprayers added five cents per pound as a premium. Garner's lamb was bought by Edwin Lide on a bid, which he later raised in order to compare with later bids, of \$4.00 per pound.

It was the first time in the 31-year history of the county show for Bovina entries to win two of the top three awards. In fact, the awards were only the fourth and fifth "major" awards in the county show for Bovina showmen.

Miss Carson joined a select list comprised of only two other showpersons who have exhibited grand champion steers twice at the county show. Jacquelyn Langford of Farwell did it in 1967 and 1974, and Mark Haseloff turned the trick in 1968 and 1972.

Bovina entrants won other honors as well in the 1978 county show. Blake Sudderth entered the breed

champion Berkshire, and Dale Turner had the breed champion Yorkshire, both in the barrow division.

Laura Widner exhibited the breed champion fine wool lamb, and Ted Clayton had the champion fine wool cross. Bovina entries won three of the four breed champion trophies awarded in the sheep show.

In addition, Miss Widner won the

showmanship award in the show's sheep division, and Steve Cockerham, Bovina FFA member, took the honors for the steer division.

Bovina showmen qualified more animals, 49, for the auction sale than any of the four communities in the county. Lazbuddie, which usually dominates county shows, qualified 34 animals for the sale, Friona showmen had 32 and Farwell 28.

## Friday Meeting Spotlights "Ag"

Ralph Roming, a local leader in the American Agriculture Movement, who was among the first group of protesting farmers to go to Washington, D.C., has requested The Blade to publicize the fact there will be an extremely important meeting this Friday night, Feb. 24, in the high school auditorium. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m.

"I cannot emphasize too strongly the importance of this meeting," Roming explained. "The economic plight of the farmer touches everyone in an agriculture area, whether one believes it or not. If American agriculture goes down the drain, so does the American economy."

"Our speakers will be Prentiss Mills of the ASCS office; Oran Watson of Tulsa; Don Kimball of Amarillo, and Tommy Kersey of Georgia, who was in the group that met with President Carter in Plains,

Ga., on Christmas Eve. "The position of Carter and Secretary Bob Bergland that the 1977 Farm Bill will work, if given a chance, cannot be accepted by anyone who knows the facts. Carter's remark that the bill will show results in the months ahead and that the strong will survive, simply is intolerable."

"Please put aside your plans for Friday night, if you can, and attend this meeting which means so much to everybody in the community, no matter what your job or business might be."

Roming also emphasized that, unless positive changes in the agriculture economic position is brought about quickly, their depressive state will be reflected in all community affairs, including business, schools, churches and any other areas in which the farmer participates so generously.

## Doctor Fund Drive Donations Needed

About a week ago, the Bovina Chamber of Commerce met with the board of directors of the Bovina Medical Center to formulate plans to actively solicit a full-time doctor for the community.

In making their comments, the Chamber representatives, with Tommy Bonds as spokesman, said they do not wish to do anything to hurt the present arrangement between the clinic and Dr. P.C. Hickman, and should a medical doctor be secured, it would be with

the provision that he share the clinic with Dr. Hickman.

A fund has been opened at First State Bank styled the "Doctor Procurement Fund," and residents or businesses interested in donating to the fund are urged to do so.

In interviewing applicants, said Tommy Williams, chairman of the clinic board, it is a nation-wide practice to pay the round-trip expenses of any doctor who comes to Bovina for an interview.

In view of these circumstances, donations are urgently needed to continue the search for a full-time medical doctor for Bovina.

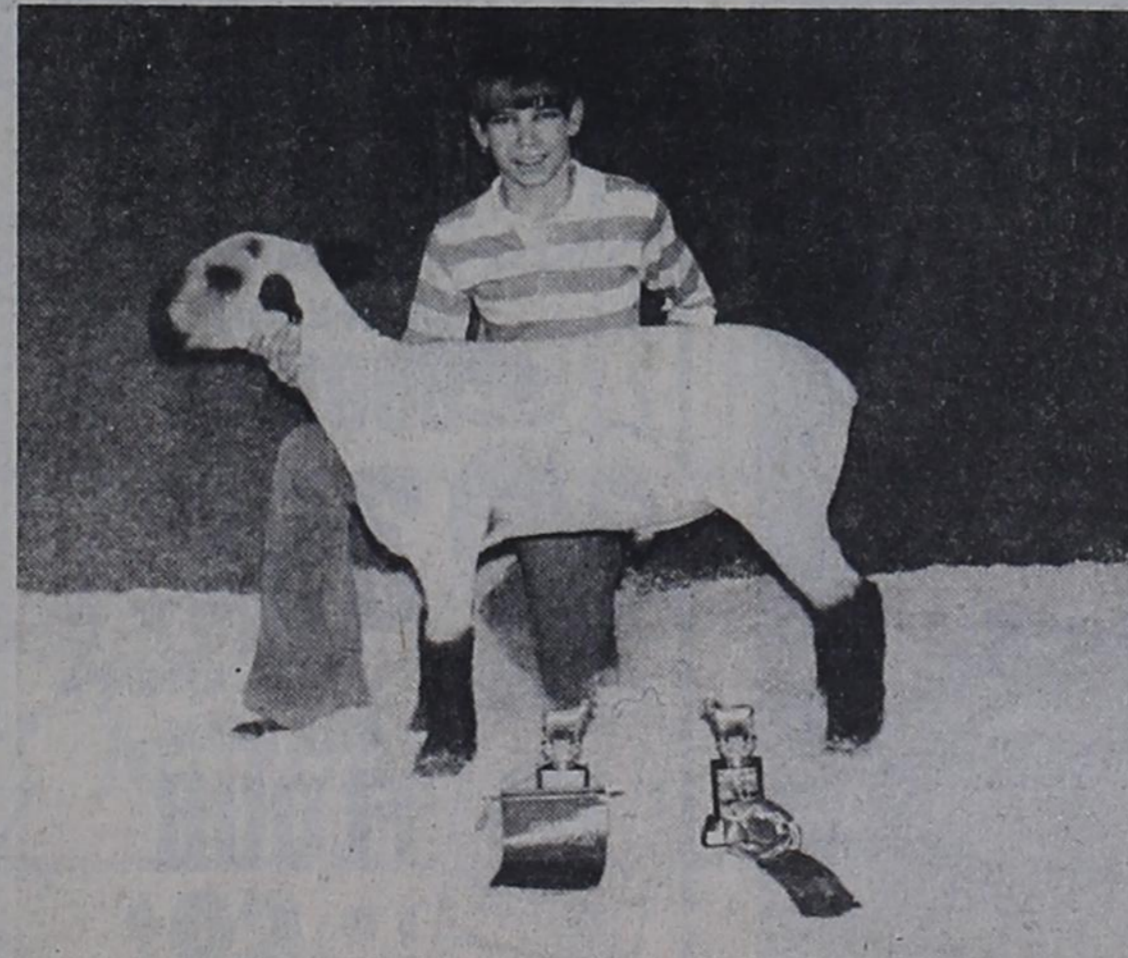
## Heart Fund Nets \$632 In Drive

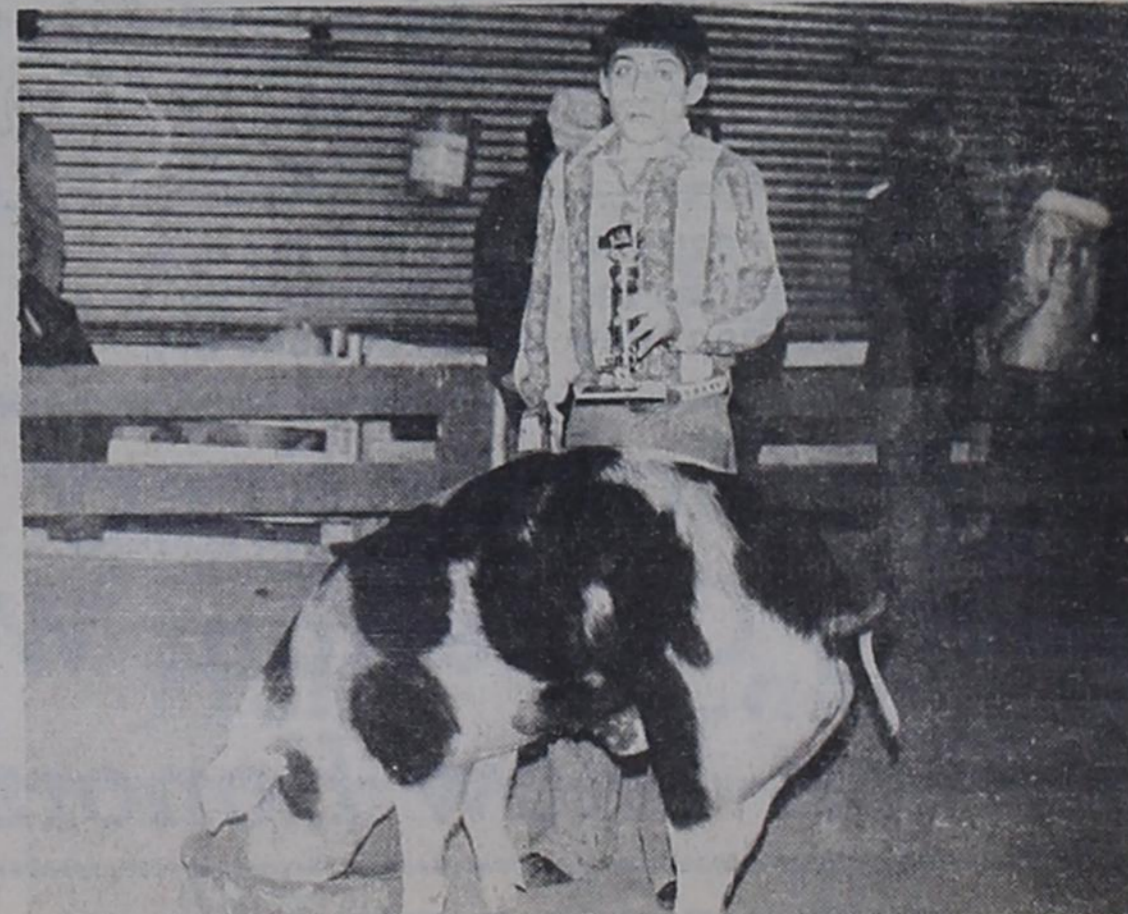

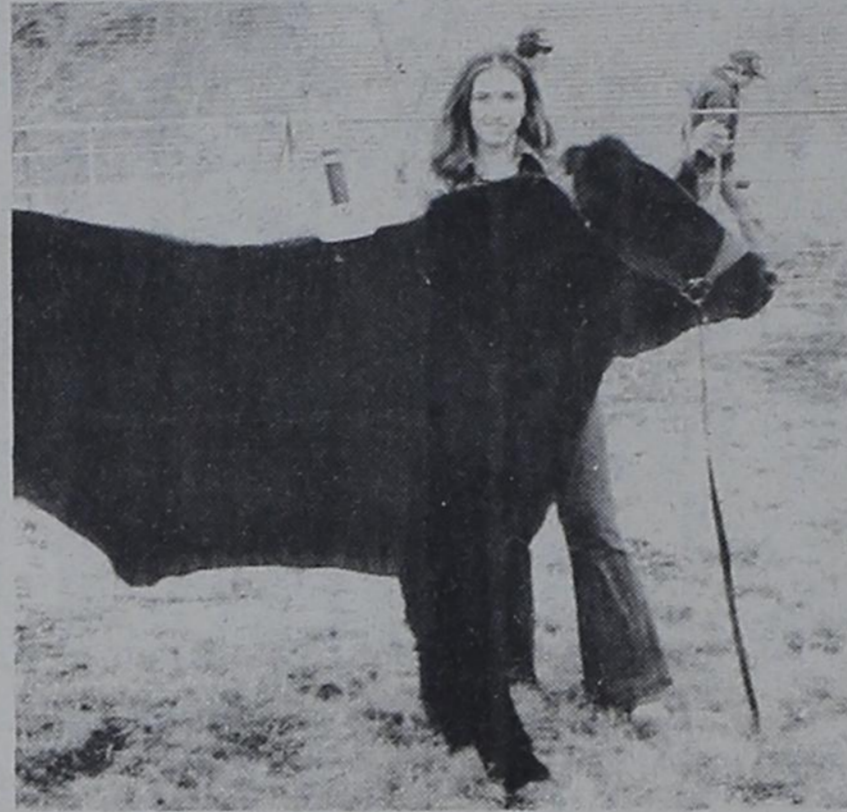

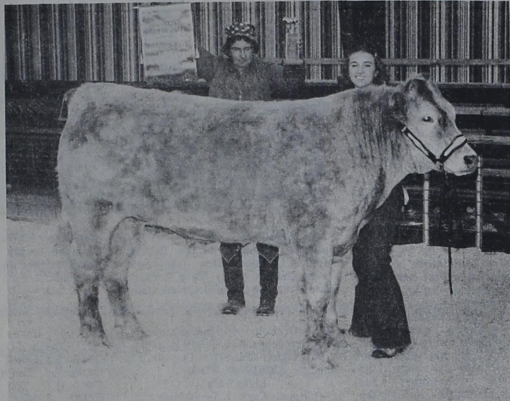


CHARLIE TRIMBLE....Walked away with the Grand Champion lamb title during the Bovina Show last week. He won first place in the heavy weight class.

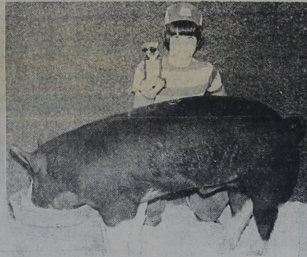

# Winners Named In Local Show

The 23rd annual Bovina Junior Livestock Show was held on February 15 at the school's agriculture barn here, with approximately 169 animals being exhibited and cash prizes, ribbons and trophies were awarded FFA and 4-H Club members.

The event was sponsored by the Bovina Lions Club and the Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture. Prize money was paid for the first six places in each class, with 23 classes entered. The cash awards ranged

downward from \$15 to \$2. Every participant received at least \$2.

Trophies were given to the champion of each breed, including eight breeds of barrows and three of lambs.

Grand and reserve champion steers, barrows, lambs and chickens also earned awards, with a trophy to the outstanding showman in each division. A committee selected the showmanship winners during the judging of the animals.

Judging the steer show, which

began at 1:30 p.m., was Bo Chunn, livestock producer from Casey, N.M. There were 14 animals in two classes.

The lamb show got underway at 3 p.m. and Jimmy Judah, vo ag instructor at Happy, Texas, had the task of judging 70 animals in eight classes.

At 5 p.m., the swine show judging was assumed by Tommy Hancock, vo-ag instructor of Olton, Texas. Seventy-five animals in 13 classes were involved in this exhibition.

FFA and 4-H members participated as their respective supervisors assisted in unveiling 14 steers, 12 breeding gilts, 73 market barrows and 70 market lambs. Many of the animals in the Bovina exhibit were slated for entry in the Parmer County Junior Livestock Show at Friona last Thursday through Saturday, Feb. 16-18.

An innovation this year was the judging of chickens, with four pens each containing three production pullets and nine pens with five broilers in each pen.

For the second year, a Pee-Wee Class of youngsters, 4 to 9, took part in showing the lambs of some of the older boys and girls and each participant in this class received a ribbon.

Trophies and ribbons were presented by Denise McCormick and Annette Stevenson, FFA Sweetheart and Plowgirl.

Achieving an extremely rare feat, Joan Carson, a senior 4-H member, exhibiting an Angus-Cross, won the grand championship prize for the fourth consecutive year.

Donna Beth Lide garnered the reserve grand champion title with an English Cross. The winning entry weighed in at 1220 pounds, while the second-place animal was rated at 1205 pounds.

In the lamb division, Charlie Trimble gained the grand champion honors and Tim Garner received the reserve grand champion award.

Jim Rhodes showed the grand champion barrow, with Ricky Mayfield exhibiting the reserve grand champion.

The chicken judging in production pullets saw Robert Ortiz named as having the grand champion and Fernando Cruz, reserve grand champion.

Honors in the broilers division went to Doug Roming, grand

champion, and Jim Rhodes, reserve grand champion.

Showmanship awards went to Steve Cockerham, steers; Laura Widner, lambs, and David Murphy, barrows.

The Ag Mechanics Class constructed a redwood picnic table, to be raffled off at the show. The winner of the table was Belinda Shelby.

The show's program made special note of the following assistance:

"A special thanks to the Bovina Lions Club and the Bovina Chamber of Commerce for again sponsoring our show. They provide the trophies and prize money for the local show. We appreciate the interest and support you continue to give the young people of our community.

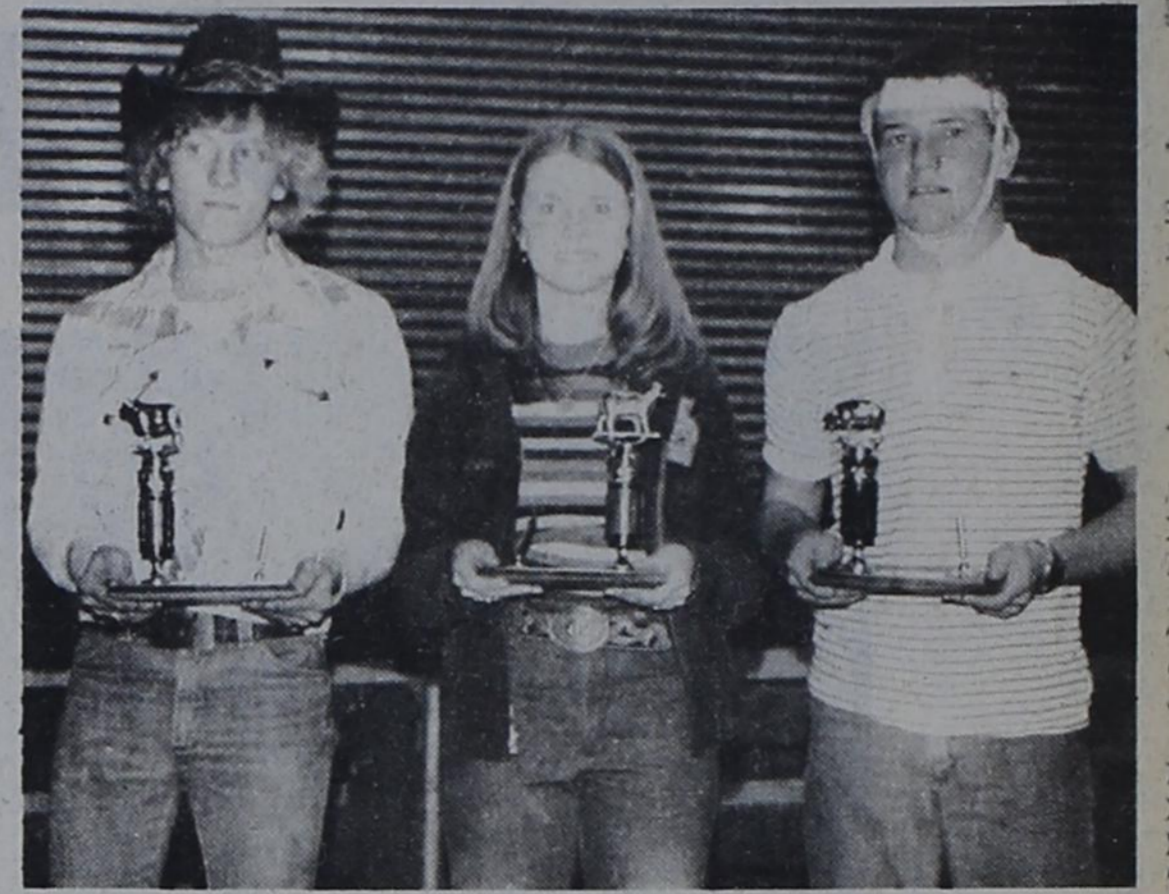

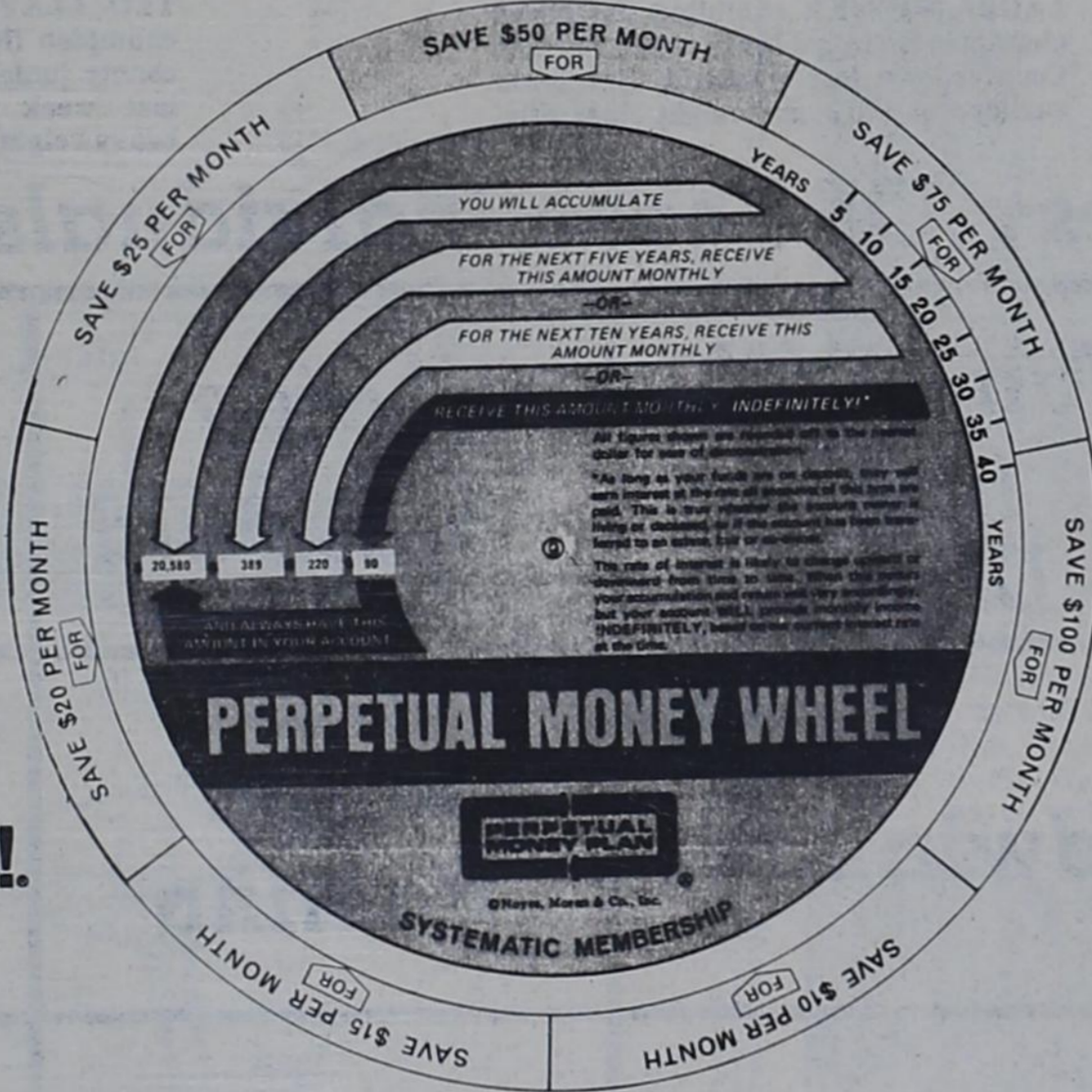

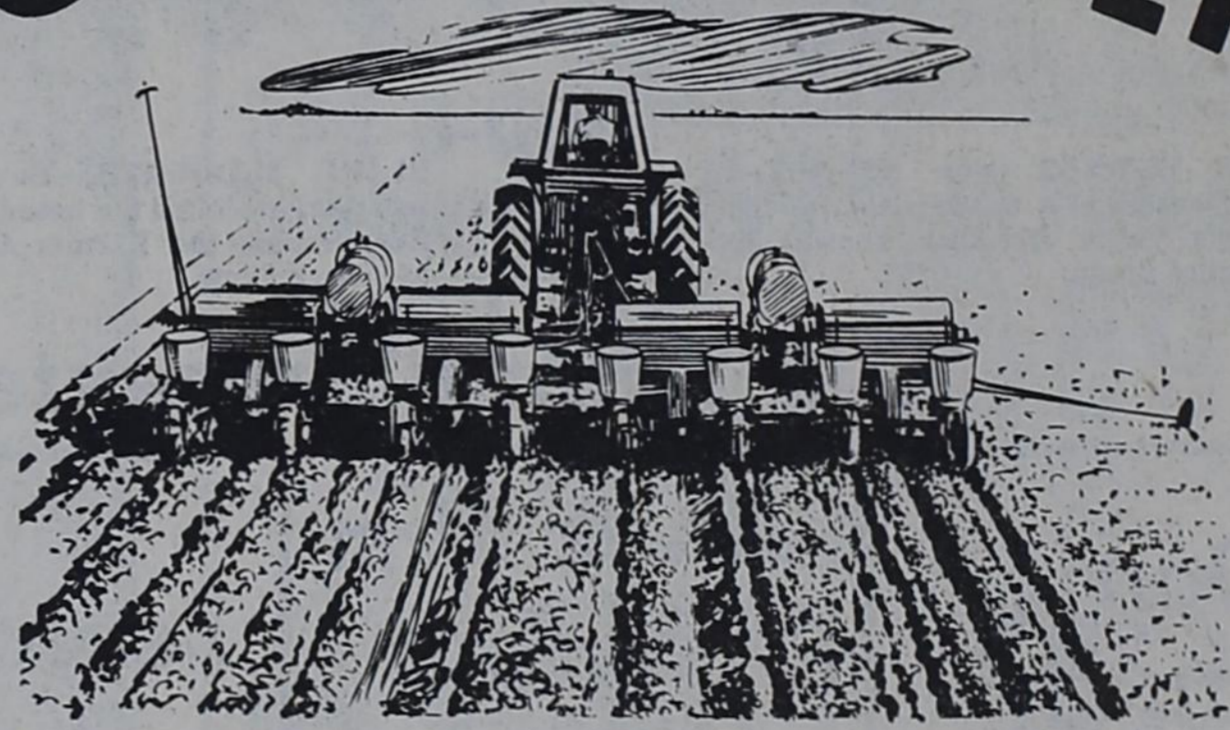

Solar heat collectors on a commercial scale will probably show up on the farm before anywhere else. Exactly when solar energy units can practically be used is still an open question. Certainly not right away, but tests performed in six states by the Agricultural Research Service indicate that low temperature drying of grain by use of simple solar collectors is technically feasible. Technically feasible and economically practical are often some distance apart. It appears this is still the case with solar drying since the main thing the ARS testing ascertained was a need for more tests. The new series of tests will be conducted during the next two years and will provide more information on economics of the various commercial systems as well as increasing the technological information available on solar energy collection.

This week we are celebrating FFA Week. FFA Week is always celebrated on the week of Washington's Birthday. This year's slogan is FFA at 50-A golden past, a brighter future. This year is the 50th anniversary of the national organization, 49th year of the Texas and the 43rd of the local chapter.

The Bovina chapter was offered locally just seven years after the national organization. Bovina Chapter held its first meetings in 1934-35 under the direction of J.T. Gee.

The present membership roster contains the names of 55 boys and girls who have a variety of different projects.

Other work in which boys and girls seem very interested in is shop work. They spend many hours in the shop learning and improving their welding techniques. The advisors feel that the experience obtained from doing work which can be taken home and shown with pride creates more interest in the work.

FFA has fields and interests other than livestock and shop work. FFA strives to combine all parts of the school curriculum such as math, English, public speaking and political science.

They participate with other schools in leadership contest regardless of the school size. Many times a group of students from a

The leadership contest consists of teams in radio broadcasting, parliamentary procedure, farm skills, public speaking, and FFA Quiz which are held in the fall of the year. Another part of the FFA contest were in the field of animal science where teams compete in livestock judging contests which are held in the spring. Contests both leadership and livestock have district, area, state and national contests.

No money is involved in the contest. The young ladies and young gentlemen compete for trophies, banners and chapter pride. The main thing stressed is for the people to use these contests as a learning experience for use now and later in life.

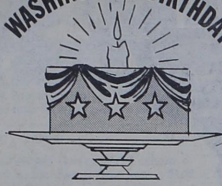
The Future Farmers of America from Bovina end their active year with a parent-member banquet that sums up the year's activities with student awards for those students that excel in FFA activities during the year.
