The Boers. are allowed to ret un their horses and saddles. The majority of them appear to be glad that the war is at an end, and that they will be able to again join their families. Among the men who surrendered to the British authorities at Balmoral, Cape, Colony, were four Americans, who will be granted free passage to Delagoa Bay. A striking sign of the altered conditions in South Africa is that Lord Milner, the British High Commissioner rode from Pretoria to Johannesburg last Saturday accompanied by only two staff officers.

A few of the Boer women still inveigh against surrender, but the general feeling among them is in favor of making the best of the situation.
