Accused By Baby.

Shreveport, La., Oct. 22 - Dick Craighead the half-brother of Ike A. Magee, who is accused of the horrible murder of Mrs. Magee and her 10-year-old son near Athens yesterday afternoon, has been saved from the vengeanceof a mob which, threatened the parish jail at Homer all last night.

The Claiborne Guards were called out at 2:30 o'clock this morning, and at 4 Sheriff Kirkpatrick summoned all the able citizens of Homer to assist him in protecting the jail. The mob, about 150 strong, seeing that the sheriff was determined, hung around until daylight and then dispersed. Shortly after Sheriff Kirkpatrick spirited his prisoner out, made a cut across the country and landed at El Dorado, Ark. The prisoner is expected to arrive in Shreveport late tonight or tomorrow morning.

There is intense feeling in the southern part of Claiborne parish over the murder. Craighead at first accused a negro but it was discovered that he had blood on his trousers and an investigation revealed the fact that he had gone to ais home, changed this shirt and tried to wash the blood off his trousers. Then the little year-eld baby who escaped unnarmed told his father that Uncle Dick had killed his mamma.

It is believed that Craighead vas crazed with liquor.



> "Raw horse flesh is a brownish red in color whereas in raw beef there is no brown, Raw horse flesh is soft and tenacious; touch it, and the finger sinks in, while as you withdraw the finger the tissues rise with it and cling to it, as though intermixed with glue. But raw beef is not soft nor tenacious in this way. Raw horse flesh, furthermore, has an odd metallic smell.

"Cooked horse flesh is denser than beef. It is as dense as a lump of cheese. In taste it is sweet-a sickening sweetness, to my mind.

"The best test or horse flesh is to take a piece of the fat and melt it. Herse fat will melt to a clear oil at so low a temperature as 70 degrees Farenheit, but beef fat won't melt to a clear oil under a temperature of 112 degrees.


