### A Paying Industry.

Cascara bark peeling has become an active industry in the forests of Western Washington. The bark is taken from the barberry and chittimwood trees that grow profusely in the Grays harbor district. It has a commercial value of 8 cents per pound. An ordinary tree yields from 50 to 100 pounds of the dried bark. Whole families are engaged in collecting the bark and selling to dealers. Some men make \$5 a day at the work. Entire sections are contracted by Eastern buyers and peelers engaged to supply the bark. There is talk of petitioning the legislature to enact laws for preserving the trees, which are more valuable than any timbe grown in the native forest. The bark is used for medicinal purposes It is estimated that one pound of dry bark will make enough liqui extract to sell for \$2, at wholesale


