The Tarahumare people, wh
live in the most inaccessibie par
of Northern Mexico, are ignoran and primitive, many still living in
caves. Hthat. vilages they tave
rer at altitudes of about 8,ooo feet
above the sea level. They are a
small and wiry yeople, with great powers of endurance. Their only
oood is "pinoll," or maize, parched
and ground. They have a peculiar Arink called "teshun," also pro
diced from maize and manyfac duced from marze and manyfac

imony which tastes like a mix ture of sour milk and tur pentine. Their language is
