Sulphur Springs, Tex., Aug. 11. -To day about noon it was learned that a negro named Jim Cherry who runs a little farm and hauls water about town, commenting upon the circumstances of this morning's lynching, has made remarks reflecting upon the young lady. It was not long until a citizen's 'committee of about seventy-five waited upon Cherry and administered a sound thrashing with baseball bats and buggy whips. He was severely bruised, but was not seriously injured. The committee gave Cherry until 5 o'clock to leave town. He left at 2:30.
