In 1868 much damage was done to the city and many lives were lost.
The disturbance of 1898 did not
result in loss of life, but caused
mneh damage to property. This

Mareh 31, and houses all over the
city were shaken to their founda tions. There was intense excite-
ment and many narrow eseapes
were recorded. The damage was particularly severe along the water

quested the publication of See, 111 of the election law which reads as
follows : "SEC. III. Any person desiring
his name to appear on the official ballot for the general primary as a
catididate for the nomination o any
office to be filled by the qualified office to be filled by the qualified
voters of a county or a portion
thereof. or for eoanty chairman. thereof, or for coonty chairman,
shall file with the county chairman
of the couty Of
later than the Saturday before, the
third Monday in Juse preceding his name to be printed on such of
ficial ballot as a candidate for the therein, giving his oscopation and Ind number of his residence
within a city or town, such request o be signed and acknowledged by
him before some officer anthorized
to take acknowledgnent to deeds. Such request similiarly signed and
heknowledged by any twenty five qualified voters resident in the
county may be filed on or before
said date, requesting that the name


 filed by the person named as a candidate therein; which request shall
be endorsed by the candidate
uamed therein, showing his consent to such candidacy if nominat-
ed. On the third Monday in June


shall meet at the county seat and
determine by lot the order in
which the names of all candidates for each nomination or position re-
quested he printed on ballot shall be printed thereon, nd decided whether the nomina-
ion of county officers shall be by majority or plurality vote, and if iv majority vote, the committee as may be necessary to make sueh
nomination, and in case the committee fails to os decide, then the nomination of such officers shall be by plurality vote cast at such election. Al such meeting the
county committee shall also care-
fully estimate the cost of printing the official ballots, renting polling places
neces.
