The courts of the entire nation are entirely too lenient in matters of this kind. More than ninety per cent of all killings, probably, have all the elements of murder, except sufficient proof to convict.

Senator Carmack's death is a calamity to the state of Tennessee! and to the nation. No matter what may be the outcome, another prominent family of Nashville is disgraced, and whether of much or little weight in public affairs, that weight has been lost. Without attempting to place blame upon any one for the unfortunate occurrence, and speaking of this and other like tragedies in the abstract, still this is beyond question one of the saddest things that has occurred in recent years.
