430 DEAD BODIES RECOVERED LOGAL TALENT WILL DON THE MIT

Removing Ruins, Whole Families Found. Appeals for Aid Sent Out by Consul General.

SAN JOSE, Costa Rica, May 7 .- The list of dead at Cartago now number not less than 1,500. The city was destroyed by an earthquake which lasted four seconds. It was a tremendous movement, which followed a few minor shocks during the day. It occurred at 7 o'clock Wednesday evening. No one had time to run out of the houses, which fell crashing to the streets. Had the great shock come during the sleeping hours hardly any one could have escaped. Transportation

In discussing the cost of transportaries' Association says that, as a rule, the producer pays the freight to the factory or market and the consumer pays the freight from the fac-tory to the point of consumption. Texas has comparatively few factories, and the cost of transportation is. therefore, of paramount importance in fixing the value of our articles of production and consumption. We have four methods of transportation, viz.: Public Highways, Railroads, Waterways and Pipe Lines.

Public Highways.

We have 121,500 miles of public highways in Texas with only 2,000 miles classed as improved oublic roads. The average cost of hauling freight over the public highways of l'exas is 43 cents per ton per mile.



43 Cents Per 7on Per Mile.

The average cost of hauling freight er the public roads of the United states is 23 cents per ton per mile. As producer the farmer gets the same price for his products whether hauled over good roads or bad roads, and a consumer the farmer pays the hanls it over good roads or bad ads. The farmer receives the benes of good roads, but pays the penalty bad roads.

Railroad transportation saves 42 cents per ton per mile as compared with public bighways, and illustrates the economy of improved methods o transportation. As a producer the twenty miles to the railroad gets the same price as the farmer who hapls i one mile, and as a consumer the far er who hauls his goods twenty miles from the railroad to the farm buys them at the same price as the farmer who hauls them one mile.





Texas has 4.95 miles of railroad per 100 square miles of territory, and Illinois has 21.8 miles per 100 square miles of territory.



The engines shown above represent the relative transportation facilities of the two States on basis of area. To equal Illinois in railroad mileage per square mile we would have to have 52,000 miles, and this increased mileage will provide facilities, cheapen the cost of transportation and develop the resources of the State.


