The bill finally passed the House at 10:30 o'clock, after the adoption of one amendment, the vote being 76 to 13. The bill was hurried to the Senate, not rewritten in full as amended, but altered by amendments pasted to the printed bill or interlined. The Sen- ate refused to accept the bill in that condition and returned it to the Housee to be copied as amended or printed. Sunday morning all were up early, the crew scrubbed decks and then had fire drill. Coffee was served from 6 to 7 a. m. and breakfast 8 to 9 a. m. About nine with the glasses we sighted a four mast steamer off our starboard stern, but it was a long

way off, at nine 'thirty a. m. we sighted a sailing vessel off our port bow, which showed up very well in

Our wireless was now in communication with the coast and Cuba. The time was passed playing Shuffled Board and rings. The sea was as smooth as the Mississippi and all seemed to enjoy the trip.

At night there was a heavy storm off the Mexican coast. The passengers chatted on deck till long after the Chinese boatswain sang out "eight belle alle welle."

Got out early Monday morning and with the glasses sighted the light house and wireless station on the coast of cape San Antonio, Cuba, and
