



College Hall had a commanding site on a hill just east of Lake Wa-The cornerstone was laid in 1871. The building was of brick and tone, with interior wooden fittings. It was five stories high with a floor space of 500 by 120 feet.

The building was divided into dormitories, administrative offices and quarters for servants. Three hundred and fifty persons slept there ast night, 250 students, 50 members of the faculty and 50 maids employed by the faculty and students. Miss Charlotte Donnel of Wiscasset Me. and Miss Virginia Moffat of Chas. Mosel, Orange, N. J., both seniors, were the peroines of the fire. They occupied rooms on the third floor under the laboratory where the fire originated, supposedly from spontaneous ombustion. The glare of the flames roused them
