Dallas, Tex., March 4.-Wholesalers say "there is some disposition among the merchants to proceed cautiously, pending the outcome of the international crisis," according to the monthly report of the Dallas Federal R-e serve Bank. However, there is considerable activity in trade, the report

There is no improvement in the situation as regards raw meterials and wholesale concerns throughout the district are finding it difficult to obtain satisfactory stocks of goods, the report says. Collections continue satisfactory and labor is generally well employed.

Cold weather during the past month damaged winter truck crops coniderably, according to the bank's information. In the Brownsville section the cabbage crop was damaged 50 per nt, but, the report says, with the rice around \$115 a ton, the damage has been more than offset.
