## TUBERCULAR DEATH RATE INCREASES AMONG GIRL

 Austin, Tex., $\overline{\text { Feb. }}$ 7.-Despite pro-nounced decline in the mortality from uberculosis, which has taken place
during the last decade, the disease is actually increasing among girls be-
ween the ages of 15 and 20 years.
This is shown clenty This is shown clearly by figure
eovering the 10 --ear period, 1911 to
920 . Adolescent girls constitute the only group in which the tuberculosis
rate has not declined. For the period, 1911 to 1916, the
death rate was 144.5; in 1919, 145.8, and in $1920,151.5$, an increase of 5
per cent. The fact that all other age groups show a decrease for the same
length of time, makes this increase very important. $\begin{aligned} & \text { During the seame } \\ & \text { period that the tuberculosis death }\end{aligned}$ rate for adolescent girls was increas-
ing 5 per cent the death rate among 25 per cent. For some time past students of tuberculosis have been givgi this question considerable thought
but as yet no satisfactory answer has but as yet no sat
been obtained.

ton so that the disease may be lo-
