

PERHAPS YOU HAVE read or heard about the proposed "bullet train" for the state of Texas. But few people in this part of the state probably realize that they might be called upon to pay tax money for such a system, yet be excluded in the train's route.

According to preliminary information, the proposed line would link the cities of Dallas, Houston, San Antonio and Austin. Sounds familiar, doesn't it? No inclusion of Lubbock, Amarillo, or a number of other Texas points.

But we can imagine that state taxes which would be used to subsidize the proposed train would no doubt be paid by all Texas residents, whether they lived in the Dallas-Houston-San Antonio-Austin areas or not.

The chairman of Southwest Airlines, Herb Kelleher, has strongly objected to seeing the state's airline industry (which is unsubsidized) placed in such unfair competition with a rail system that "increases travel time, raises fares, degrades the air transportation
