





Dona Ana county reported sometime ago that the removal of a large number of quail from the range east of the Organ mountains would be distinctly advantageous.

The permit issued to Mr. Carlton specifically provides that the quail secured shall be used for brood stock, and that an equal number shall be returned to the Department of Game and Fish in 1935. These 500 birds will, when returned to the department, be released on such areas as are in need of restocking.

No quail have been sold or given away for commercial, or other purposes. The birds covered by the Carlton permit have been oaned to him during a year when these was an abundance of quail. Next year there may be a scarcity, and the return of these birds will then save expensive trapping by the department for transplanting purposes.

When the Ligon game farm at Carlsbad was established some years ago on a commercial basis, various kinds of game birds were loaned to Mr. Ligon by the department, including quail, prairie chickens, turkeys, etc. All such oans have now been returned to he department, and no loss whatver was sustained by the department or the sportsmen.

Mr. Carlton expects to secure through purchase outside of the state, additional quail for brood stock.


