reduced-price meals for children served under the National reduced-price meals for children served under the National
School Lunch/Breakfast Program. The Office of the
Ster School Lunch/Breakfast Program. The Office of the
Superintendent has a copy of the policy which may be
reviewed by any interested party reviewed by any interested party.
The household size and income criteria identified below will be used to determine eligibility for free and reduced price
benefits. Children from households whose income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free or redur at or meals. Foster children who are the legal responsibility of a welfare agency or court may also be eligible for benefits
regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside. Eligibility for the foster child is based on the child's
income. income.


Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability of free and
reduced price meals for their children. Applications also are reduced price meals for their children. Applications also are
available at the principal's office in each school. To apply for
free and reduced price meals, households must application and return it to the school. Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information
households provide on the application will be used for the households provide on the application will be used for the
purpose of determining eligibility and verification of data. Applications may be verified by school officials at any time
during the school year.
For school officials to determine eligibility for free and reduced price benefits, households receiving food stamps or AFDC only
have to list their child's name, food stamp or AFDC case number, and an adult household member must sign the application. Households who do not list a food stamp number
or AFDC case number must list the names of all household members, the amount and source of the income received by each household member, and the social security number of the
adult household member who signs the application. If the adult household member who signs the application. If the
adult who signs the application does not have a social security adult who signs the application
number the household member must indicate that a social
sururity number is not available by writing the word "none." security number is not available by writing the word "none."
The application must be signed by an adult household The app
member.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal policy the school secretary will review applications and datermine eligibinty. Parents or guardians dissatified with the ruling of
the official may wish to discuss the decision with the reviewing official on an informal basis. Parents wishing to make a
formal appeal for a hearing formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make
request either orally or in writing to Sue Nuttall, Supt., P.O request either orally or in writing to
Box 70, Bovina, TX, (806) $238-1336$.
Households that list a food stamp or AFDC case number must
report when the household no longer receives these benefits. Other households approved for benefits based on income
Onformation must report increases in household income of over $\$ 50$ per month or $\$ 600$ per year and decreases in household size. Also, if a household member becomes unemployed or if
the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the household
eligible for benefits if the household's income falle eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below
the levels shown above. In the operation of child feeding programs administered by the
US Dept. of Agriculture, no child will be discriminated against because of race, color, sex, national origin, age or handicap. If discriminated against, they should write immediately to the
