Representative payees are
appointed to handle the funds of Social Security beneficiaries who funds. To carry out this responsibility, the representative payee
must keep informed of the
person's current and future needs. person's current and future needs.
The representative payee's first responsibility is to make certain
that the person's day-to-day needs that the person's day-to-day needs for food, clothing, shelter, and
personal expenses are met. personal expenses are met.
Beneficiaries who can handle small amounts of spending money should have this made available to
them. Social Security benefits may them. Social Security benefits may
then be used for any special needs, such as school expenses, rehabilitaton or medical expenses, insurance premiums, or payments on a house in
an interest.
Any money that remains after
basic and special needs are met must be saved or invested. Money
should not be kept at home where it can be lost or stolen, and should not be mixed with the representa-
five payee's own funds. Preferred investments are United States
savings bonds. These should be savings bonds. These should be
registered in the name of the beneficiary and with his or her
Social Security number. The Social Security number. The
representative payee is listed in his or her capacity.
Surplus funds should be kept in an interest-bearing account that shows the beneficiary as owner.
