INTERNATIONAL terrorism is probably the number one problem in the world today. Due to the "space" given to terrorism in the mass media, this is no surprise to anyone. What people don't want to hear is the fact that the problem is likely to get worse before it gets







A permit must be obtained from the Texas Department of Agriculture prior to the application of any hormone-type herbicide in Parmer County, beginning April 1, 1986. A permit fee of ten cents per acre will be charged for each permit. Permits expire when the acreage for which the permit was granted has been sprayed, or after 180 days.
