Fife, Texas, June 27. Editor Brady Standard:

In the Standard of the 14th inst. Mr. G. W. Anderson of Rochelle came out against good roads in McCulloch county, and while the bond issue would not effect my taxes I believe someone should try to show him where he is wrong in his views.

I have always been in favor of better roads and the development of McCulloch county and I shall try to answer Mr. Anderson's tirade against the same.

In the first place Mr. Anderson had no kick coming on the bond issue proposed by the Brady Commercial Club as it would effect only the Brady commissioner's precinct and neither he nor I would be taxed one cent



#### Idle Lands.

The prosperity of a community depends upon the activity of its property and the people. Improved public highways afford facilities for marseting production, stimulate commercial activity and otherwise encourages agricultural development. To increase agricultural production we must bring under cultivation idle land and increase the yield per acre.

We have in Texas 167,865,000 acres of land. Of this area there are 2,118,000 acres of water surface. All our land is susceptible to a high degree of cultivation except the city area' and a small portion of our land which is mountainous. We now have less than 30,000,000 acres of land under cultivation, leaving 137,000,000 acres of land that has never been plowed. Idle land is of course no value to a community, and to increase our prosperity we must put activit; into our vacant lands. The following cut illustrates the relative proportions of our cultivated and uncultivated areas:



#### Texas Land Comparison.

There are 109 counties that have ess than 10 per cent of their land under cultivation. There are 43 counties that have a larger uncultivated area than the total area of the State of Rhode Island. The uncultivated area of Texas, says the Commercial Secretaries' Association, exceeds the total area of the thirteen original olonies, excepting Georgia and North Carolina. We need 3,000,000 farmers to develop our agricultural resources, and no country on the obe affords the opportunities to the comeseeker that Texas now offers. The land agent is an important factor n the development of agriculture. There are 190 people moving to Texas daily, and remain here permanently and of this number probably half of



Through the Stethoscope. The doctor hears some curious noises when he places the stethoscope against your chest. 

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
