RURAL ROUTES AND ROADS.

Postal Department Has Become Strong Agency of Highway Improvement. The marvelous development of the rural mail service shows how greatly the people prize this daily blessing and indicates that they would be extreme ly reluctant to give it up or he deprived of it for any cause. This being so, the postal department has in its power to become a stronger agency for highway improvement.

There are certainly tew communities that would give up their mail service rather than improve their roads, and if the department should see fit to put it up to the people where the roads are bad, give them the choice of making better roads or doing without mail, it seems that they would, in common parlance. "get busy." The department has sent out a number of bulletins containing a warning, and these are said to have been partially effective. Part of the last bulletin issued to post masters contained this:

"You are directed to inform yourself with reference to the condition of roads and bridges on the rural routes out of your office, and if you find that they require improvements you should present the matter in the strongest and most positive way to the patrons and road officials, informing them that improvements must be made as soon as practicable. If, after a reasonable time has elapsed, the improvements have not been made or started, you will report the fact to this office in order that action may be taken looking to the discontinuance of the service.
