The store of the Broad Mercaptile Company was burglarized Saturday night, goods to the value of about \$50 being taken. The articles missed are two 22caliber rifles and one 38-caliber Winchester, some razors, pocket knives, etc. It is thought that the thief hid himself away in the store Saturday afternoon, making off with the plunder after the store force had gone home for the night. This would be very easily done, as the building is extra large and the back rooms contains merchandise of a description which would afford many hiding places. The thief left the building through a rear door which the proprietors are positive was closed and locked Saturday night, and which was found open Monday morning.

On Monday City Marshall Sheridan arrested a Mexican on suspicion. A big forty-some-odd Colts six shooter was found on him and he was locked up on a charge of carrying concealed

The officers have had their eyes open for a bunch of thieves thought to be operating locally for some time, and Monday they got wind of a certain Mexican camp near Melvin. Going out to investigate they found the camp plentifully supplied with goods and merchandise of every description. 

There is never a season so wet in West Texas that an increase of cropcannot be produced by one or more irrigations, and in some of the produced



dry years a good irrigation outfit will nearly always pay for itself in the extra crop over what would have been gathered from the same land without water-

The illustration shows a modern flume constructed of sheet iron three feet in width and curved to a half circle. This flume is on the farms of J. C. and R. A. Brazil, on the Colorado River in San Saba county. The pumping plant was installed by Hall Machinery Co. of Brownwood and consists of a thirty horsepower Foos Gasoline Engine and a number six volute pump which will deliver 1200 gallons of water per minute at an elevation of 58 feet above the

water level in the river. The plant is an unusually efficient ore and is large enough to water 125 acres at a cost of thirty-five cents for fuel for each threeinch wetting on an acre of land.

Brazil Bros.' engine, pump, pipe, belt and valves cost them a little over \$1400 cash, and in order to reach their farms, they built over a mile of ditch along a mountain side and four flumes aggregating about 1200 feet, making their The trip from Brady to Dallas total installation cost them about \$20.00 per acre to put the pumping plant at
